### Meditations on Holy Mass

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)  
2<sup>nd</sup> August 2020

**First reading:** Isaiah 55.1-3 CCC 694, 2121; 762

*Come, buy and eat!*

**Second reading:** Romans 8.35, 37-39

*Nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of  
God in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

**Gospel:** Matthew 14.13-21. CCC 448. 1329; 1335.

*All ate and were filled.*

God created us so that we would find true happiness. We can be really happy only by responding to that divine love. In the *first reading*, the sacred writer teaches that God desires us to approach him. And so the prophecy speaks in God's voice, "Come to me." In his *Gospel*, St. Matthew tells us that Jesus, both true man as well as true God, went away in a boat from the crowd and sought solitude after hearing of the death of John the Baptist. When the crowd followed him on foot, a much longer journey, he had compassion for them. At once, without hesitation, Jesus opens himself to them and he cures their sick. Then he satisfies their natural hunger in abundance. In the *second reading*, St. Paul reminds us that neither obstacles nor even created goods can satisfy the longing of our hearts. God never turns us away, no matter what hard journey brings us to him.

**Before Mass:** *A great crowd had gathered about Jesus, and they had nothing to eat. He called his disciples and said to them, "I feel compassion for all these people". (First Vespers)*

**After Mass:** *With the five loaves and the two fish the Lord fed five thousand men. (Lauds)*

**Later in the day:** *They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining; twelve baskets full. (Second Vespers)*
