# Prayer of Intercession

# Prayer leader:

# Let us turn to Christ Jesus who is Lord both of the dead and of the living. As we look forward to the joys of God's kingdom, we pray with confidence:

# R: Lord, hear our prayer.

# Assisting minister:

# 1. Open the door of eternal happiness to our brother/sister N and welcome him/her into the glory of eternal life.

# 2. N. was entrusted with your light in baptism: surround him/her now with the radiance of your undying light.

# 3. N. was nourished at the table of the eucharist: bring him/her rejoicing to the eternal feast of heaven.

- # 4. Be merciful to all who mourn: give them the consolation of your Church's faith.
  - # 5. Renew our longing to greet you when you come again, and keep us vigilant until that day.
  - # 6. Be with us at the moment of our death: may we be found faithful in your service and leave this world in your peace.

# Concluding Prayer:

# Holy Lord, almighty and eternal God,

# [*divine address*]

# Hear our prayers for your servant N, who you have summoned out of this world. Forgive his/her sins and failings and grant him/her a place of refreshment, lift and peace. Let him/her pass unharmed through the gates of death to dwell with the blessed in light, as you promised Abraham and his children forever. Accept N. into your safekeeping and on the great day of judgment raise him/her up with all the saints to inherit your eternal kingdom.

# Invitation:

## # Prayer over the Place of Committal

- # Form A = if the place of committal is to be blessed (collect)
- # Form B = of the place of committal has already been blessed (acclamations of praise + collect)
- # Form C = when the final disposition of the body is to take place at a later time (collect)

## # Committal

# Because God has chosen to call our brother/sister N. from this life to himself, we commit his/her body to the earth [or the deep or its resting place], for we are dust and unto dust we shall return. But the Lord Jesus Christ will change our mortal bodies to be like his in glory, for he is risen, the firstborn from the dead. So let us commend our brother/sister to the Lord, that the Lord may embrace him/her in peace and raise up his/her body on the last day.
