#### FROM THE PASTOR:

**BROUGHT TO MY ATTENTION:** This is cold and flu season. Really. We have a responsibility to take care of ourselves and those around us! We do have an obligation to attend Mass but only if we are well enough. Please don’t come to church and infect others in our parish family. God knows the individual’s desire to receive the Eucharist and the Church acknowledges “Communion of Desire” as truly receiving the Body and Blood of Christ even if you are at home due to illness! If you are an Extraordinary Minister and feeling poorly, find a replacement or notify the sacristan for your Mass and stay at home. Spend an hour in prayer – watch Mass on EWTN, read the Bible, pray a Rosary, etc. “Remember to keep holy the Lord’s Day.”

**RECEPTION OF THE BLOOD OF CHRIST.** Another note. It is the individual’s responsibility to choose or not to choose to drink from the chalice. If you are sick, you should choose to stay at home. If you come and feel uncomfortable about receiving from the chalice, then don’t. I don’t want to make that decision for the entire parish by not offering both species.

**INTINCTION.** Yet another note. It is **NOT** permitted for an individual to self-intinct the host received. Intinction was an “experiment” in the Church in the 70s and 80s. It was stopped.

#### LENTEN ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

The Church teaches that Catholics in good health between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday; all Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. The U.S. Bishops clarify that fasting, at minimum, means partaking of only one full (meatless) meal and two smaller meals that do not equal the main meal. Abstinence from meat forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products, seafood or condiments made from animal fat (like butter).

We fast out of love for Christ Crucified, seeking to become more closely conformed to Him through penance and self-denial, uniting our sacrifices to His Passion for the sanctification of our souls and the salvation of the world.

Connect your fasting with almsgiving so that self-denial is also a self-gift. Consider giving your time and money which you would usually spend on yourself to others as an act of love.

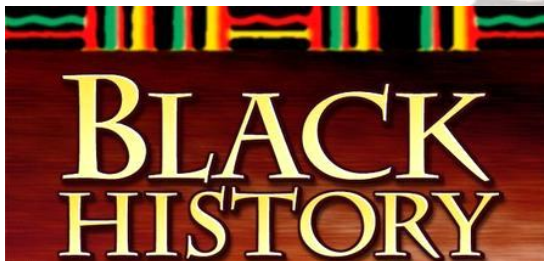

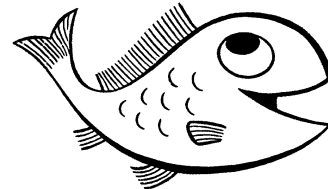

## K of C Measure Up Campaign

The local Measure Up campaign collection will take place on May 4th and 5<sup>th</sup> at Wal-Mart and Rural King. The “flagship” charity of the Ohio Knights of Columbus has long been **Support for Citizens with Developmental Disabilities**. In recent years, the Knights of Columbus have been recognized as a major corporate sponsor to the International Special Olympics with many local councils, including many in Ohio, that sponsor local events.

The primary fundraiser assisting those with developmental disabilities is the annual **Measure Up Campaign**. This fundraising effort raises approximately \$370,000 for over 322 statewide and local caring agencies that sponsor a variety of training and support programs. Of the money collected, 80% is returned to the local councils for donating to their local agencies. The remaining 20% is used for statewide programs.
