### **LENTEN ABSTINENCE AND FASTING**

The Church teaches that Catholics in good health between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday; all Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. The U.S. Bishops clarify that fasting, at minimum, means partaking of only one full (meatless) meal and two smaller meals that do not equal the main meal. Abstinence from meat forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products, seafood or condiments made from animal fat (like butter).

We fast out of love for Christ Crucified, seeking to become more closely conformed to Him through penance and self-denial, uniting our sacrifices to His Passion for the sanctification of our souls and the salvation of the world.

Connect your fasting with almsgiving so that self-denial is also a self-gift. Consider giving your time and money which you would usually spend on yourself to others as an act of love.

**EASTER FLOWERS:** If you wish to donate a spring flower in memory of a loved one, please use the envelope in your packets; there are also extras available in the church. We request a \$15.00 donation per flower. Be sure to include the name on the envelope of the individual whose memory you are honoring, and do not put loose checks in the regular collection basket without the special envelope. Donations must be received by Monday, **March 19th**, in order for their names to appear the weekend of Easter Sunday.

SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE DINNER: Join your parish family Tuesday evening, February 13th at 6:30 p.m. in the Hall for a time of pre-Lenten food and fellowship on "Fat Tuesday." The theme is "breakfast for dinner." Pancakes, Belgium waffles, toppings, and drinks will be provided. Please bring the following items based upon on the first letter in your last name:

A-H – Breakfast Casseroles (example: Egg, quiche, French toast...etc.)

I-P – Fruit, Pastries or other type of sweets.

### Ash Wednesday: It's All About Love


Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are on the same day this year.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, the season that prepares us for Easter. We get ashes on our foreheads to remind us that we belong to God. Ashes are in the shape of a cross because we are saved from our sins by Jesus' cross and resurrection. During Lent, we step up our Christian practices of prayer, almsgiving (that means helping others), and fasting. Fasting is when we go without something to show that God is all we need. We might give up treats and give the money to the poor, for example. Lent is 40 days long because that's an important number for Christians. We remember that Jesus fasted for 40 days in the desert to prepare for his ministry.

This year, Easter falls on April 1 (and that's no joke.) Counting 40 days back from Holy Saturday (skipping Sundays because they're not part of our Lenten fast), we arrive at Ash Wednesday, which falls on February 14 this year.

Ash Wednesday isn't a day for parties and celebrating, In fact, many Christians abstain from (that means give up) meat. Healthy Catholic adults fast or eat smaller meals. So if you're disappointed about missing some Valentine's Day fun this year, remember that the rewards of loving God and others are better than the sweetest valentine candy! Week 2: Feb. 25: Food Pantry—non-perishable food items: peanut butter, can fruit and vegetables, can soup, boxes of mac-n-cheese, cereal, and canned meats.

Week 3: March 4: Haven House: women's razors and deodorant, toilet paper, body wash, shampoo, laundry detergent, tooth brushes & tooth paste, and hair brush/combs.

Week 4: March 11: Elizabeth Hope: baby diapers (any size), baby onesies, sleepers.

**Week 5:** March 18: Men's shelter: deodorant, toilet paper, razors & shaving cream, shampoo, paper towels, and socks,

**Week 6:** March 25: Gospel Road Mission Trip: paint brushes, painter's tape, roller pan liners, paper towels, drop clothes, garden gloves, and lawn bags.


