BLESSING OF THE THROATS: Next weekend will be the Blessing of the Throats in honor of St. Blaise.

“Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts, he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His religion spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century, he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.”

(Book of Blessings 1625)

Details regarding the miraculous healing of the boy vary. One account relates that the miracle occurred during the journey to take Blaise to prison when he placed his hand on the boy's head and prayed; another that the miracle happened while Blaise was in prison when he picked up two candles provided to him and formed a cross around the boy's throat.

The National Catholic Youth Conference is a powerful, biennial, three-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for Catholic teenagers (of high school age) and their adult chaperones. More than 21,000 young people and their chaperones attended 2017 NCYC in Indianapolis. The 2019 National Catholic Youth Conference is November 21-24, back in Indianapolis, with the theme Blessed • Broken • Given; Bendito • Partido • Entregado.

What happens during NCYC?

The program includes keynote presentations, prayer, workshops, Mass, and opportunities to participate in reconciliation and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, as well as recreational activities, concerts, and exhibits. A key component of NCYC is the thematic park which is a blend of traditional exhibit booths with interactive areas featuring service projects, games, recreation, live musical performances, arts, and sports.

How do I sign up and How much does it cost?

Teens interested in attending should contact their youth minister. Registration begins March 1, 2019. Cost is between \$515-700 depending on the accommodations that you pick. The help ease the trip cost, a payment plan has been arranged. Scholarships are available, as well as fundraising will be done.

HOPE HOUSE OF PICKAWAY COUNTY



In the Spring of last year, local churches and community members came together to address the homeless shelter situation for men and men with families in Pickaway County. Aside from Haven House, which shelters women and children, there wasn't a place in Pickaway County for homeless men or men with families to stay to meet basic needs like food, shelter, water, showers, clean restrooms, and laundry services.

As a result, our community came together to open Hope House of Pickaway County at 2146 N. Court Street (formerly known as The Circle Shelter) as an emergency overnight shelter for men and men with families, open from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m., seven days a week. A soft opening occurred in November and 318 people have been served since that time.

Funds are needed to continue the essential services provided by Hope House. As a result, **St. Joseph Parish has decided to add Hope House as a collection for the month of February. You will see a special envelope in your upcoming packet. Please consider your support of Hope House.**
