

From the Pastor: Basic Questions and Answers about the Catholic Faith

Here is a continuation of the most basic beliefs of our Christian Faith. Some of these questions and answers are verbatim from the Baltimore Catechism and others are compiled from Sacred Scripture and Tradition. Many of these will require memorization for those making their first Holy Communion and receiving Confirmation. All adults of course should have these answers memorized too.

****Who started the Church?**

Jesus Christ started the Church.

****What kind of Church did Jesus establish?**

He established one Church, a holy Church, a catholic or universal Church, and an apostolic Church. Therefore, we Christians believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

****What does it mean to say the Church is One?**

The Church is one because her Founder, Jesus Christ established a community, a kingdom where everyone professes the same one faith.

****What does it mean to say Jesus established a Holy Church?**

Jesus established a holy Church because He Himself is holy. He never committed one sin, not even a little one. Therefore, there will always be holy people in the Church, who make up the Church, and who help other people to become holy like Jesus is holy.

****What does it mean to say the Church is Catholic or Universal?**

To say that the Church is catholic or universal is to say that the Church is all over and that these Christian people all across the world believe the same divinely revealed truths given to the Church by Jesus Christ.

****What does it mean to say that the Church is Apostolic?**

To say the Church is apostolic is to say that Jesus chose certain men to govern the Church. These men are known as the apostles. Today we call these apostles Bishops who are directly connected to the first twelve apostles of Jesus.
