REVISED GUIDELINES FOR PARISH LIFE ... Parishioners who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear a face mask at Mass. Children under 12 who are not vaccine eligible and those under the age of 16 who have not be vaccinated, may accompany and be seated with a vaccinated adult. Those who are not fully vaccinated should observe 6-foot social distancing from individuals not in their household and wear a face mask except with receiving Holy Communion. Even if vaccinated, we ask you to stay six feet from others who are wearing a mask. Hand sanitizer will still be available at the church entrances. At Communion, parishioners are responsible for maintaining social distancing from those not in their household. Please note that Communion should be received in the hand only as this is the best way to ensure everyone's safety at this time. Thank you for your continued understanding and cooperation.
