

## Class Expectations for Remote Learners

- Watch morning assembly with Ms. Gonzalez at 8:15.
- Sign on to class zoom no later than 8:30. You should sign on right after morning assembly to ensure you get on by 8:30. Video and audio should be turned on.
- Be dressed in school uniform. On gym days you should be wearing your gym uniform.
- Be back after lunch no later than 12:30. I will be admitting students back in from the waiting room a few minutes before that time.
- Make sure your work area at home is free from distractions so you can focus on the teacher and on connecting with your class. Mute your microphone when you are not speaking.
- Have all your books and supplies with you in your work area. If you are using a portable device make sure it is fully charged to start the day. Make sure your microphone is also at its highest volume on whatever device you are using. You need to be heard by everyone. For Math you should have a calculator near you for concepts that involve calculator use or you should know how to use an online calculator.
- Class participation is an important part of your grade. Raise your hand to ask/answer a question. Speak clearly.
- No eating during class.
- Drinking of water is permitted.
- Complete and submit assignments on time. Make sure your name and date are on all assignments submitted.
- If you have trouble with the internet or can't log in to zoom, have your parent email the teacher of that class. If it is a zoom issue, then you should always go to the enrichment center on each teacher's class page and do work from there for the day. Contact the teacher for the work missed that day.

## Class Expectations For In School Learners

Arrive between 7:45-8:15. If you plan on eating breakfast, try to arrive by 8:00.

Make sure you are in complete uniform. On gym days wear your gym uniform.

Have all supplies and books with you each day. On Creative Arts day, make sure you have those supplies as well.

Class participation is an important part of your grade. Raise your hand to ask/answer a question. Speak clearly.

Complete and submit assignments on time.

Make sure your name and date are on all assignments.

Make sure you pay attention to when your chrome book needs to be charged.

## Grading Policy

As stated in the Parent/Student Handbook, the achievement mark is based on mastery of material covered in class.

1. classwork/participation
2. homework
3. quizzes
4. formative assessments(most of these are used to inform teachers of areas that might need more emphasis or review)
5. summative assessments

For Math classwork and homework assignments, I use a check system. Check plus indicates mastery, check indicates that the work is good but there were some errors, and check minus indicates that the student did not have a good grasp of the concept and had many errors; student can always redo problems that were wrong to better the grade. Quizzes are usually given on one or two concepts and are not worth 100 points (I do give what the equivalent value would be out of 100 so it is easier to know how your child did). Summative assessments are given on a few concepts or at the end of a unit and are worth 100 points.

For ELA some assignments will be graded using the check system mentioned above, while others will receive a letter grade (A+, A, A-,etc.) It will depend on what type of assignment it is. Quizzes will take various forms. Some will be writing assignments that will be graded as a quiz and others will be exams of a few questions in length. Summative assessments will be exams of longer length or projects.

### Homework

When written homework is not given, students should be reviewing the material taught in class that day. If classwork is not completed during the school day, it will need to be completed for homework.

### Absent Work

On the day that a student returns from an absence, he/she should ask me for the missed work(in person learner) or email me to get the missed work(remote learner)
