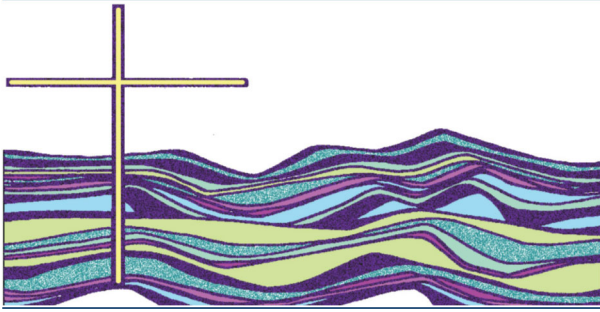

ASKING FOR HELP

The Beatitudes praise the poor in spirit. One characteristic of those who are poor in spirit is their ability to ask for help; they know when others can provide what they lack. Today's readings encourage us to practice poverty in spirit by asking God for what we need. What could be more natural than to ask God for good things? God is, after all, the inventor of goodness and the giver of all good things.

Asking God for help puts us in conversation with God. These conversations take many forms. The reading from Genesis shows Abraham bantering with God like a skilled negotiator, while Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians praises God for answering us even when we don't deserve it. In Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus not only gives us words to use in our conversations with God (the Our Father), but also promises that God always listens to our prayers.

Come and Celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Acadiana Style! Fete-Dieu du Teche, Eucharistic Boat Procession down the Bayou Teche, will take place on the **Feast of the Assumption, Thursday, August 15**. All are invited to a Mass in French at 8 AM at St. Leo the Great Catholic Church in Leonville to begin the day. His Excellency J. Douglas Deshotel, D.D., bishop of the Diocese of Lafayette will preside at an 8 AM French Mass and give the homily. At the end of Mass there will be a procession from Church with the Blessed Sacrament and a statue of Mary down to the nearby boat landing. At 9:30 AM boats will embark in procession down the Teche toward St. Martinville, retracing the voyage of the early Acadians. The boat procession will stop at churches in the towns along the Teche for Rosary and Benediction (arriving at Arnaudville behind St. Francis Regis at 10:20 AM; arriving behind St. Joseph Church in Cecilia at 11:45 AM; arriving at the Pavilion behind St. Bernard Church in Breaux Bridge at 1:35 PM; arriving at the park behind S. Joseph Church in Parks at 3:15 PM; and arriving at Old Market Street in St. Martinville at about 4:45 PM). Upon arriving in St. Martinville, a foot procession will commence to Notre Dame de Perpetual Secours, then to St. Martin de Tours, and finally down main street to Mater Dolorosa Chapel for Solemn Vespers and Benediction at 5:30 PM. Confessions will be heard in mobile units at each of the stops along the way.
