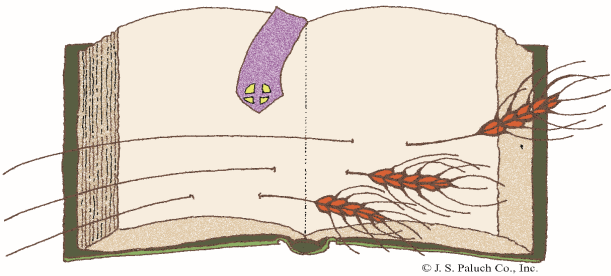

Dear Parishioners:

With the permission of our governor and bishop, we may now hold limited gatherings inside our Church buildings with an occupancy of **50%**. The Mass schedule will remain the same; Saturday Vigil Mass at 4:00 PM; Sunday Morning 7:30 and 10:30 AM here at **St. Charles Church** with a maximum attendance of **260** parishioners. At **Christ the King Mission** we will continue to celebrate Mass at 9:00 AM with a maximum attendance of **100**.

- * Although Mass is public, all remain dispensed from their Sunday obligation. Persons who are ill (fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, loss of taste/smell, etc.) and those with pre-existing conditions should not attend Mass.
- * It is strongly recommended that attendees wear face masks.
- * Please bring your own hand sanitizer if you are able.
- * At all times, there must be a 6-foot spacing between groups and other individuals or groups.
- * For the time being, the Bishop recommends Holy Communion be received in the hand.
- * Doors will open 30 minutes before each Mass. Those gathered will form a line to enter in single file, keeping a 6 foot distance between each household.
- * As you enter, there will be hand sanitizer and a mask for any who has forgotten to bring one.
- * Families who live together are allowed to sit together in one pew, Individuals are asked to sit at either end of the pew which will be marked. Please keep a social distance of 6 feet.
- * For Communion, please form a single file, socially distanced line in the middle aisle.
- * Ushers will dismiss one pew at a time. Any door may be used as an exit.

Additionally:

The Church will be thoroughly sanitized between each Mass.

Any person who handles unconsecrated hosts and ciboria before Mass does so with sanitized and gloved hands while wearing a mask.

FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice—that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before.

Jesus too speaks of food come down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. And Paul reiterates to the Corinthians and to all of us that in the bread and in the cup, we share in the body and blood of Christ.
