A couple of special notes from Ric Smith

Wow! We had another amazing Kairos weekend experience at the Allen Correctional Institution in Lima. There were 24 resident inmates who participated in the weekend, each one of them bringing baggage of hurt, anger, rejection and more. Kairos is not about conversion. Kairos is about sharing the love of Jesus. I was very fortunate to be part of this weekend and witness these men, who admittedly made wrong choices to get them incarcerated, opened the door of God's mercy and asking Him for forgiveness. This transformation to a changed or renewed faith in Jesus is just spectacular.

I would also like to share: On October 21, I was asked to take part in the annual Red Cross Banquet at the Allen Correction Institute. This ceremony is to recognize all of the resident Red Cross members for the contributions that were made in the 2016-2017 fiscal year. The Recycle Plastic Bag project is just one of a few projects that the inmates contribute to. I was very happy to hear that about 60 of the mats that the inmates made from recycled bags, along with sleeping bags were shipped to the Houston Red Cross for the hurricane Harvey response. Sleeping bags are made using scrap material from their uniform shop. They also make mittens and slippers for the homeless shelters from scrap material. They crochet stockings, scarfs, mittens and hats, and provide them to shelters. They crochet Christmas stockings and stuffed animals for children in under privileged families. They cross-stitch Baptismal stoles and shawls for the local churches in Lima. They do quilting of blankets and bedspreads, again using scrap material and crochet blocks. Collectively, 231 inmates at ACI worked 34,419 hours in the Red Cross program. For many, idle time is wasted, unproductive and dangerous time. The guys volunteering at the Allen Correctional Red Cross chapter are making good use of idle time. . . . Ric
