2019 Triennial National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS)

The AMS receives no funding from the U.S government or the U.S. Military, has no parishes for a weekly in- pew collection, and must rely principally on private donations to an annual operating budget of over \$8.2 million.

Established by Saint John Paul II in 1985, the AMS is responsible for providing the full range of pastoral ministries available in all U.S. dioceses to those serving in the United States Armed Services, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and for the families of these populations.. In other words, the AMS is responsible for the pastoral care of men, women, and children from all U. S. dioceses, who hail from all 50 States and U.S. Territories.
