Cans of Soup, Cereal (dry or instant)

Last weekend (Nov. 9th & 10th) 1-8.25 oz bag of Multi-Grain Tortilla chips, 1-28oz jar of creamy peanut butter, 1-15oz can of peas, 1-15oz can of whole beets, 5-24 oz jars of tradition sweet basil pasta sauce, 1- 32 oz box of beef stock, 2-14.5 oz cans of "heat & eat" beef barley soup, 1-14.5 oz can of "heat and eat" hearty ham & bean soup, 2-13.8 oz cans of condensed chicken noodle soup, 7-10.5 oz cans of condensed cream of mushroom soup, 2-12 oz boxes of corn squares cereal, and 2-18 oz round boxes of quick oats were collected and taken to the NB Food Pantry.
