In order best to safeguard the Catholic faithful and the greater community from the serious threat and spread of the Corona virus/COVID-19, Bishop Daniel E. Thomas, in union with the Bishops of Ohio, has decreed **all publically celebrated Masses and other liturgies in the Diocese of Toledo will be temporarily suspended.**

This decree is effective immediately and will remain in place at least through the celebrations of Holy Week and Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020. All the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass during this time in accord with the Code of Canon Law. **We will keep you updated as we receive them!**

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

Today we celebrate Laetare Sunday, named for the first word in the opening antiphon: "Rejoice." Lent can seem burdensome with its emphasis on penitence and sacrifice. But today we look with anticipation to its end in the Easter miracle. Jesus' resurrection is the light at the end of the tunnel. Let us give thanks for the light he gives to our lives.

Introduction to the liturgy of the Word

1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a

Samuel anointed David to be king

Psalm 23

"The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want."

Ephesians 5:8-14

Rise from the dead, children of light.

John 9:1-41 or 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38

I know this much: I was blind, but now I see.

In the first reading God chooses the overlooked son of Jesse, for God sees beyond appearances.

In the Gospel, the Pharisees cannot see past the appearance of sin whereas the man who was formally blind sees that Jesus is Lord.

As we listen to or read the readings, let us think about our blind spots and the times when we fail to see beyond appearances

For the Church, to bring to light whatever is hidden in darkness and heal the wounds that have gone unnoticed, **we pray to the Lord.**

For government leaders, may they continually work to insure the well being of the most vulnerable in their care, **we pray to the Lord.**

For victims of extreme human rights violations-those who have been abducted, tortured, or executed-and for their families and loved ones, **we pray to the Lord.**

For all of us, as we resolve to look beyond appearances and attempt to see the face of Christ in all whom we meet, **we pray to the Lord.**
