### **Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day**

How are we using what has been entrusted to us? Today Jesus tells the parable of the talents. Two of the servants use them to make more; the third buries his in the ground. Are we using our talents as well as we could? As we celebrate the Eucharist today, let us consider how we use our God-given talents and how we could use them more beneficially.

### **Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word**

1st Reading - **Proverbs 31:10-3, 19-20, 30-31**

*The value of a worthy woman is beyond measure.*

**Psalm 128** - "Blessed are those who fear the Lord."

2nd Reading - **1 Thessalonians 5:1-6**

*"The day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night."*

Gospel - **Matthew 25:14-30 or 25:14-15, 19-21**

*The parable of the talents*

In the reading from Proverbs, a man finds a trustworthy and praiseworthy partner, one whose value is "beyond pearls." In the Gospel, another man find trustworthy and praise worthy servants, ones worthy of handling all his possessions. We would do well to look at ourselves. Does our spouse or close family member consider us trust worthy and praiseworthy? How about our employer? How about God? As we listen to these readings, let us consider how we can more trustworthy and praise worthy in the eyes of those whose perspective we value.
