**Statement from Bishop Daniel E. Thomas on the recent violence at the Capitol.**

In the wake of the violence and attack on the United States Capitol Building this week, as Americans and people of faith, we condemn and denounce such acts of lawlessness, affronts to the very freedom and democracy for which we stand. In the midst of this turmoil, polarization and division, we pray for peace for our nation, that civility and order may be restored, and that all men and women of good will may respect one another in charity and in truth.

“The peaceful transition of power is one of the hallmarks of this great nation. In this troubling moment, we must recommit ourselves to the values and principles of our democracy and come together as one nation under God” writes Archbishop Jose’ Gomez, President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. May these days see not further division, but efforts toward unity for the common good; not hatred and violence but reason and reconciliation. May we work together toward healing the wounds which tear at the fabric of our nation, and may Christ’s peace reign in our hearts (Col 3:15).

### Introduction to the liturgy of the Day

Today's Gospel features Jesus calling his first disciples. The invitation is welcoming and intriguing: "Come, and you will see." How are we called by the Lord? The Lord has called us all today on this Sunday in the middle of January and so we come together to listen to God's word and to receive our lord in the Eucharist.

How is the Lord speaking to you today?

### Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

**1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19**

*Speak; Lord your servant is listening.*

**Psalm 40** *"Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."*

**1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20**

*Your bodies are members of Christ.*

**John 1:35-42**

*They saw where he was staying and they stayed with him.*

God calls Samuel in the middle of the night in today's first reading. Samuel is confused, but eventually he responds, "Speak, for your servant is

listening." John's disciples are listening when he points to Jesus and says, "Behold, the Lamb of God." They follow Jesus at once. Let us listen or read God's word, ponder how we ourselves are called, and recommit ourselves in the following of the Lord.

How can I discern the Lord's call among the many voices in my life? Is there an intermediary I can trust to recognize the Lord's voice?
