**Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word**

**Ezekiel 2:2-5**

*They are a rebellious house but shall know that a prophet has been among them.*

**Psalm 123**

*"Our eyes are fixed on the Lord,  
 pleading for his mercy."*

**2 Corinthians 12:7-10**

*I will boast in my weakness, in order that the power of Christ may dwell in me.*

**Mark 6:1-6**

*A prophet is not without honor except in his native place.*

 Speaking the word of God can be tough. God warns Ezekiel that he will need to speak out against a stubborn and rebellious people. Jesus meets with opposition when preaching in his hometown. Saint Paul speaks of the hardships he faces. Speaking out on behalf of our faith can be as difficult for us now as it was for them then. But we know, like Paul, that we have the power of Christ dwelling within us.

 It is a paradox of Christian life that in weakness we are made strong. St Paul recognizes this phenomenon. He endured frequent hardships on his three lengthy missionary journeys, routinely traveling through hostile territory. He relied on the generosity of others for his basic needs, choosing to dedicate his life to preaching the gospel to the ends of the earth. He was arrested and imprisoned more than once, and constantly had to worry that he would not be able to continue his missionary activity. Those who knew him must have wondered how he could keep doing it.. Gradually they came to realize that it could not have been some innate ability of Paul's that sustained him through all his difficulties. It must be the power of Christ. His faith, his reliance on the Lord, made the presence of Christ stronger within him, making Christ's power more apparent to others.
