### Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

In today's Gospel, people from towns all over Galilee hurried to see and hear Jesus. His heart was moved, for they appeared to be "sheep without a shepherd." Jesus is that shepherd. Jesus is *our* shepherd. He has drawn us here today, from different households, from different families, perhaps even from different towns. We come to day to celebrate the Eucharist, this wonderful sacrament that Jesus established to be celebrated in his name until the end of time, this sacrament in which we receive our Lord, our redeemer, our shepherd.

### Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

**Jeremiah 23:16 1-6** *I will gather the remnant of my flock and appoint shepherds for them.*

**Psalms 23** *"The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want"*

**Ephesians 2:13-18** *Christ is our peace who made both one.*

**Mark 6:30-34** *They were like sheep without a shepherd.*

In the Gospel we hear or read today, Jesus invites his disciples to take a break and rest awhile. He invites us to do the same today. As we rest our minds and bodies, let us listen to God's word. Jeremiah tells his people that one day a king and shepherd will come to bring justice to the Land. Paul writes that in Christ walls are broken down and peace established among all peoples. Jesus laments the directionless people massed on the shore. And so he began to teach.

Mark does not tell us the "Many things" that Jesus taught the vast crowd (6:34), but we do know the lesson he taught the Twelve. He taught them what their priorities should be. Tired and hungry, they hoped to get some rest away from the townsfolk, some of them they may have just visited when Jesus sent them out two by two. But their plans were changed in an instant, for Jesus' heart was moved to pity. Compassion caused them to turn their attention away from themselves and their need for food and rest so they could attend to strangers in need of healing and guidance.
