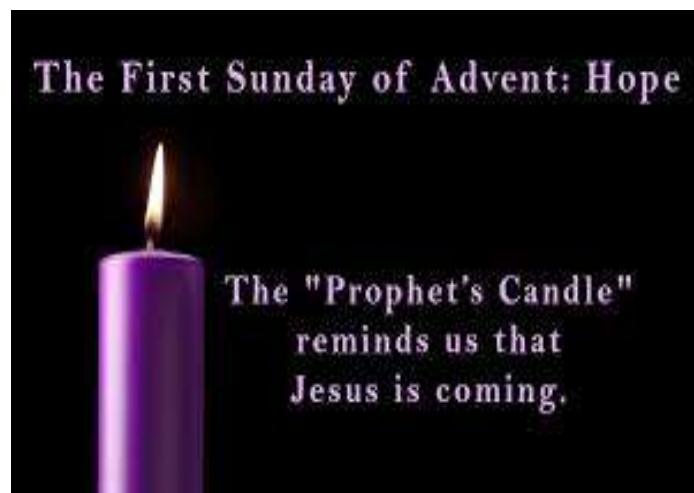

**Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day**

Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord, whom we portray as a precious infant in a simple manger at the end of the season. But there are two more arrivals of our Lord to contemplate during this season of preparation and they tend to be over looked. One day Jesus will come again in glory as the world ends and he delivers his final judgment. He gives a glimpse of this to his disciples in today's Gospel. But let us also consider his third appearance--to each of us personally, into our hearts and into our lives as we embrace him as his disciples.

**Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word**

**The First Reading** is from the **Book of the Prophet Jeremiah 33:14-16** *I will raise up for David a just shoot.*

**Psalm 25** *"To you, O, Lord, I lift my soul."*

**The Second Reading** is from the **first Letter of Saint Paul to the Thessalonians 3:12-4:2**

*May the Lord make you abound in love.*

**Gospel Luke 21:25-28, 34-36** *Be vigilant at all times.*
