Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

The **First Reading** is from the **Book of the prophet Isaiah 60:1-6**

The glory of the Lord shines on all people.

Psalm 72

"Lord every nation on earth will adore you."

The **Second Reading** is from the **Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6**

The Gentiles are coheirs of the promise.

Gospel of Mathew 2:1-12

The magi come with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh

Though Jerusalem had been laid waste by the invading Babylonian army and the Israelites were just beginning to return there, Isaiah foresaw the day when it would draw people and riches from near and far. The psalmist proclaims that all nations will adore God, for justice and peace will flower throughout the land. ~Continued next column~

~People of every nation, says Paul, are members of the same body of Christ as those who heard the gospel from Jesus directly. In the Gospel, the magi from the east are led by the wondrous star to the humble stable where Jesus lay. As we hear or read these passages, let us contemplate our faith through the eyes of an outsider.

Isaiah mentions gold and frankincense, gifts befitting a king. But the magi also bring myrrh-used to anoint a body after death-because this king is also victim, called to suffer, like Isaiah's suffering servant, for the sins of all.
