Respect Life News: "The March for Life" this January, like every January over the past several decades, reminds the nation that killing an unborn child is never a private matter. Abortion is a uniquely intimate form of violence—but violence with bitter public consequences. Catholics eagerly join the March for Life each year because we believe in the God of life and joy; a God who creates every human being with innate dignity and rights, including above all the right to life....if we don't at least try to conform our lives to what we claim to believe, then we're fooling only ourselves, because God cannot be fooled. When we claim to be 'Catholic' but then don't advance our beliefs about the sanctity of the human person as the basis of law, it means...we're either very confused or we're very evasive....Are we troubled enough about what's wrong with the world—the killing of millions of unborn children through abortion; the neglect of the poor, the disabled and the elderly? Do we really have the courage of our convictions to change those things?" In almost three weeks, "thousands of good people will march for life in Washington." The march is "an opportunity to prove the strength of our convictions; to show to the world what we really believe about the sanctity of human life. I'll be there. And I ask you to join me."
