

## 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Supply list 2021 - 2022

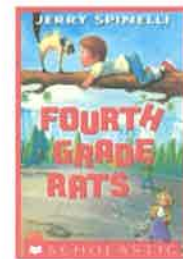


The following is the ***Summer Reading List*** for your children who will be entering ***Grade 4*** in the September 2021. The books that are listed below are ***REQUIRED*** readings. These books may be purchases at local bookstores (Barnes and Noble, Amazon, etc.). The book list has been formulated in accordance with the New York State Common Core English Language Arts Curriculum Standards.

Students, you will choose on the above books and create a **Cereal Box Report**. You will use the attached information to create your Cereal Box Report, and bring it in when you return to school in September.



## Cereal Box Book Report

For your summer reading book report or *Hatchet*, *Pollyanna*, or *The Secret Garden*, create and decorate a real cereal box with illustrations and information related to the book

**FRONT OF BOX:** Use a piece of white or light colored paper to: cover the front of your cereal box. (You will probably want to create the cover before gluing it on your box.) Include the name of the cereal and a picture. Invent a name for the cereal that is related to the title of the book and sounds like a cereal. Do not use the exact title of the book. You may want to look at the attached page of real cereal boxes to get some ideas. Choose a shape for the cereal as well as colors and ingredients that all relate to the book.

For example, for *The Cat in the Hat*, you might invent a cereal called *Crunchy Cats*, a toasted oat cereal in the shape of miniature hats.

**RIGHT SIDE:** Make a list of ingredients that includes the story elements *Characters and Setting*. Under the heading "Ingredients," list the main characters and write a sentence about each one. Then describe the setting. You can use the template on the attached sheet or cover the side with white or light colored paper and do it in your own way. Just make sure you include the main characters and the setting.

**LEFT SIDE:** Write a summary that describes the main problem and the solution of the book. Try to use words that will “grab” readers’ attention and make them want to buy your cereal. You can use the attached template or do this in your own way.

**BACK OF BOX:** Design a game that is based on the story. It can be a puzzle, a word search, a word scramble, a maze, a crossword puzzle, a hidden pictures illustration, or any other fun activity that might be found on the back of a cereal box. Make sure it includes information from the book.

**TOP OF BOX:** Include the title, author, number of pages, and number of stars you would give this book if you were a book critic. The maximum number of stars would be 5. You can use the template or create the top of the box yourself as long as you include all of the things listed above.

**PRIZE:** Cereal boxes often include a prize. Your prize must be something the main character could have used in the book or something that reminds you of the main character. You can even include a picture of the prize on the front of your box to let the reader know what is inside the box.

**Left Side of Box:** Cut out this box and place in on the right side of your cereal box.

Write a summary that describes the **main problem** and **how the problem was solved**. Try to use words that will “grab” the readers’ attention and make them want to buy your cereal.
