As part of the course selection and scheduling process, your guidance counselor plays a key role in helping you plan your academic career and beyond. It is our desire that summer school becomes a most enjoyable and rewarding educational experience. Summer School slots will be filled on a priority basis.

The priority is: 1. North Ridgeville students 2. Students from other school districts

Registration

Important: Mail-in registration for in-district students only must be submitted prior to June 7. Out-of-district registration will only be accepted during Open Registration. Summer school open registration will be in the North Ridgeville Academic Center 5-8 Media Center.

Cancellation

Classes may be cancelled or consolidated based on final enrollment. This may occur up to the first day of Summer School. Unless notified, all classes will be held as scheduled.

Session Length

The summer school week is Monday – Thursday, no Fridays. Classes are offered on a 3-week basis. Each course is a semester course (0.5 credit). **Students may earn up to two credits, BUT can only register for one credit at a time. Students must be completed with their first full credit by the end of the first session, July 3, 2019, in order to register for another class. If a student takes a second course and does not complete the work, there is no reimbursement for the class.**

Notes

Parents will be notified before a student is dropped from the Summer School Program. Grades will be sent home upon completion of the course and to the home school, if other than North Ridgeville City Schools.

Payment

Payment for Summer School courses must be received prior to the first day of Summer School – June 18, 2019. Payment may be made to the Summer School Office by cash, personal check, or credit card. A late fee of \$25.00 will be applied to any registration (Elementary, Middle and High School) after 12:00 p.m. June 18, 2019. Special payment arrangements must be approved in advance by the Summer School Coordinator. In the event a payment plan has been established, please note that all Summer School fees must be paid no later than the last Monday of Summer School – July 22, 2019. If payment is not received by this date, credit will not be given for the class that was taken.

Fees and Refunds

Fees must be paid on or before the first day of summer school. A student who arrives on the first day without having paid will not be enrolled. Payment should accompany all registrations. A late fee of \$25.00 will be applied to any registration (Elementary, Middle and High School) after 12:00 p.m. June 18, 2019.

No refunds will be given except in the event a class is cancelled due to lack of enrollment. No refunds are given to students who are expelled from summer school due to disorderly conduct or serious violation of the student code of conduct or violation of attendance policy.

No Bus Transportation is provided

Student may ride bicycles, but they are to be kept outside and locked. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen bicycles. Students may drive to summer school. They are required to park in the designated parking lot on the south side of the building. No cars are to be entered or moved during school hours.

Code of Conduct

The complete Code of Conduct will be given to each student on the first day of school. The Code of Conduct for Summer School is the same set of guidelines followed during the regular school year.

Discipline procedures are the same as used during the regular school year. These include parent conference, detention, and suspension. Attending Summer School is a privilege and not a requirement. Students are expected, therefore, to assume the responsibility of appropriate behavior.

Summer School Attendance Policy

Summer School provides a semester-long program in three weeks at the secondary level. Therefore, regular attendance is extremely important. One day missed is worth four days of instruction, as it takes 60 hours to earn one credit.

- When a student is absent from Summer School, the parent or guardian must notify the school of the student's absence. This may be done prior to the day of absence through written communication or by telephone. Parents are required to call the school 216-777-2777 if the student will be absent for any reason.
- If the student's absence is not cleared in advance, the parent or guardian must notify the school on the day of absence. When calling the school the parent must have a reason for the absence.
- Students are expected to make up work missed. During Summer School, the 3rd absence will result in the removal from the class and a failure for a 3-week course being taken.
- Each time a student is tardy to school or class, it is recorded as a quarter day absence from the course. A ½ day absence is recorded for the student who is an hour late to class. A full day is recorded after two hours.
- If the school is not notified of the student's absence, the school will attempt to notify the parent(s) by telephone or written communication.
- In cases where there has been no parent contact, the student must present, immediately upon his/her return to school, a dated note from the parent. The note should contain the student's name, reason for the absence, date of absence, and the parent's signature.
- If you are absent or sign out during the day, you are expected to have a parent/doctor's note upon returning to school. You will have one day to turn in a doctor's note. (Example: If you were absent on Monday and returned to school on Tuesday, you would have until Wednesday morning to bring a note.)
- The Ohio Revised Code lists the following as legal reasons for absences:
 1. Personal or family illness or injury
 2. Quarantine
 3. Death in family
 4. Emergency or set circumstances judged as sufficient causes by school administrators
- Students who have been absent from a class more than 2 times will not receive credit for the course and will not be refunded for the course. All absences after the initial 2 days must be due to doctor certified illness, suspension, approved activity, certified court appearance, or death in the immediate family.

I. Intervention/Achievement Test Study Groups

Kindergarten Intervention

This course is specifically designed to help students having difficulty with beginning reading. Instruction will focus on Language Arts skills.

1st Grade Intervention

This course is specifically designed for students who are reading below grade level. Instruction will focus on basic Language Arts and/or Math skills and Language Arts and/or Math comprehension. This course is especially helpful to students as preparation for upcoming Ohio State Tests.

2nd Grade Intervention

This course is designed for the student who has experienced difficulty in Language Arts and/or Math. The reinforcement and strengthening of skills will be stressed. This course is especially helpful to students as preparation for upcoming Ohio State Tests.

3rd Grade Intervention

This course is designed for the student who has experienced difficulty in Language Arts and/or Math. Stress will be placed on reinforcing comprehension and strengthening problem-solving skills. This course is especially helpful to students as preparation for upcoming Ohio State Tests. The summer English Language Arts test will be administered on July 10th.

4th Grade Intervention

This course is designed for the student who has experienced difficulty in Language Arts and/or Math and whose skills are below grade level. Stress will be placed on reinforcing comprehension and strengthening problem-solving skills. This course is especially helpful to students as preparation for upcoming Ohio State Tests.

Grades 5/6 Language Arts Intervention

This course is designed for the student who is considered academically deficient or is experiencing difficulty in Reading or English, or on any of the Reading State Tests. The reinforcement and strengthening of skills will be stressed. This course is especially helpful to students as preparation for upcoming Ohio State Tests.

Grades 5/6 Math Intervention

This course is designed for the student who is considered academically deficient or is experiencing difficulty in Mathematics, or on the Math State Test. Stress will be placed on reinforcing and strengthening problem-solving skills. This course is especially helpful to students as preparation for upcoming Ohio State Tests.

Grades 7/8 Language Arts Intervention - **APEX COURSE

English Foundations: This course offers skill building and strategy development in reading and writing. It is a reading program designed to help struggling readers develop mastery in the areas of reading comprehension, vocabulary building, study skills, and media literacy. The course stresses high interest, engaging use of technology, relevant topics, and robustly scaffolds practice. Students learn to use different types of graphic organizers as they develop and internalize reading and writing process strategies. They build confidence as they develop skills and experience success on numerous low stakes assessments that encourage growth and reinforce learning.

Grades 7/8 Math Intervention - **APEX COURSE

Math Foundations: This course is designed to expedite student math skills through grades 6 - 8. The program simultaneously builds the computational skills and the conceptual understanding needed to undertake high school level math courses with confidence. The course's carefully paced guided instruction is accompanied by interactive practice that is engaging and accessible. Formative assessments help students to understand areas of weakness and improve performance, while summative assessments chart progress and skill development.

****APEX courses** are online courses that are completed in a North Ridgeville computer lab and are accessible at home.

Students are expected to do class work on a computer for a minimum of 5 hours a week in addition to the scheduled summer school hours.

II. High School Courses

All courses being offered are APEX semester courses. APEX courses are online courses that are completed in a North Ridgeville computer lab and are accessible at home. In addition to the scheduled summer school hours, students are expected to work on APEX course work outside of summer school for a minimum of 5 hours a week. **Students may earn up to two credits, BUT can only register for one class at a time.** Students must be completed with their first credit by the end of the first session, July 3, 2019, in order to register for a second credit. If a student takes a second credit and does not successfully complete the course by Thursday, July 25, 2019, there is **no reimbursement** for the class. Students who do not complete the entire course with an overall score of **at least 70%, pass the midterm/final with 60% and keep a notebook** will **NOT** be given credit and will be given an "F" for the class. Courses will begin Tuesday, June 18, 2019 from 8:00 a.m. - 10:30 a.m., depending on availability. Enrollment is contingent upon number of seats available for the APEX courses.

High School Summer End-of-Course Testing

Tentative administration dates for the EOC State testing will be July 15-26, 2019.

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English 9 Semester 1 and/or English 9 Semester 2 - Grade 9

Open to all students with average or below average skills. This study of English will include a study of World Literature, Composition, and Speech.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

English 10 Semester 1 and/or English 10 Semester 2- Grade 10

Open to all students with average or below average skills. This course will continue the study of World Literature, Composition, and Speech.

Prerequisite: Completion of English 9

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

English 11 Semester 1 and/or English 11 Semester 2 (American Literature) - Grade 11

Open to students with average or below average skills. This course contains the study of American Literature.

Prerequisite: Completion of English 10

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

English 12 Semester 1 and/or English 12 Semester 2 - Grade 12

Open to all students with average skills. This course will contain the study of British Literature and Composition.

Prerequisite: Completion of English 11

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

World History Semester 1 and/or World History Semester 2 - Grade 9

This course offers the study of the influences of geographic settings, cultural perspectives, economic systems, political developments, and military developments in the period from 1750 through the present.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

American History Semester 1 and/or American History Semester 2 - Grade 10

This course is a survey of the development of our country from the beginning as a British Colony through to the contemporary world. Primary attention is on the political, industrial, social and military development of the United States.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

American Government - Grades 11 & 12

This course discusses the three branches of the Federal Government with comparisons of state and local political units. Students will learn the basic concepts of government and how each can and should influence decisions.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Economics - Grades 11 & 12

This course will focus on how individuals, corporations and nations make economic decisions.

3-week course

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Algebra I Semester 1 and/or Algebra I Semester 2 - Grades 9-12

This course studies the language and ideas of Algebra, formulas, equations, graphs, fundamental principles and processes, and problem solving. The purpose is to master the fundamentals and applications of elementary Algebra.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Geometry Semester 1 and/or **Geometry Semester 2** - Grades 9-12

This course studies two-dimensional Euclidean Geometry. This emphasis is on the correct thinking and includes a study of rectangular figures, circles, area, proportions, special formulas, regular polygons, loci, and irregularities.

Prerequisite: Algebra I

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Algebra II Semester 1 and/or **Algebra II Semester 2** - Grades 10-11

This course is designed to immediately follow Geometry. Students recommended for Geometry should not sign up for this course. The course covers in much greater detail and depth the concepts from Algebra I. Also covered are topics on matrices, radicals, exponents, the binomial theorem and quadratic equations. Each student is required to have a graphing calculator. (Preferred model – TI 83 Plus or TI 84)

Prerequisite: Algebra I and Geometry

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Algebra II A Semester 1 and/or **Algebra II A Semester 2** - Grades 11

This course is designed to follow Geometry Concepts. It is the first of a two-part course covering the topics of Algebra 2. Each area will be taken at a slower pace with more review than a standard Algebra 2 course. Topics will include equations and inequalities, linear relations and functions, systems of equations and inequalities, and quadratic functions and relations. Each student is required to have a TI-83 or TI-84 graphing calculator, though the TI-84 is recommended.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Physical Science Semester 1 and/or **Physical Science Semester 2** - Grade 9

This course includes the following topics: scientific method, laws of motion, energy, nature of waves, sound, earth's crust, periodic table, chemical bonds, acids and bases and nuclear energy.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Biology Semester 1 and/or **Biology Semester 2** - Grades 9-12

This course will include the concept of life and life processes with emphasis on the human and everyday experiences related to life science.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Chemistry Semester 1 and/or **Chemistry Semester 2** - Grades 9-12

This course will cover atoms, molecules, elements, compounds, states of matter, solutions, basic chemical reactions, chemical safety, and practical applications of chemical knowledge. A calculator will be used occasionally.

3 weeks per semester (½ credit)

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

Personal Finance - Grades 9-12

Personal finance helps students recognize and develop vital skills that connect life and career goals with personalized strategies and milestone-based action plans. Students explore concepts and work toward a mastery of personal finance skills, deepening their conceptual understanding of key ideas and extending their knowledge in a variety of problem-solving applications.

3-week course

½ Credit Cost: \$130.00 Non-Resident: \$170.00

III. High School Enhancement

Physical Education - Grades 9-12 – Also open to incoming 9th graders

The student will participate in team sports and individual lifetime recreational activities with a licensed teacher. Tuition includes the cost of field trips and transportation.

Health Education - Grades 9-12 – Also open to incoming 9th graders **APEX COURSE

Skills for Health is a valuable, skills-based health education course designed for general education in grades 9 through 12. Skills for Health helps students develop knowledge, attitudes, and essential skills in a variety of health-related subjects, including mental and emotional health; nutrition; physical activity; substance use and abuse; injury prevention and safety; and personal health, environmental conservation, and community health resources.
