FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17th. In Lent, we are asked to prepare for the celebration of the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord by means of fast and abstinence from meat on certain days. These regulations unite us to the prayerful activities of the whole Church throughout the world. They are binding on people from ages 18 to 59 years of age – except for those who are ill. Meat should NOT be eaten on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting, that is eating only one full meal during the day is required on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and may be practiced on any other days. These regulations are minimum guidelines to help us get into the penitential spirit of Lent.
