

## Please Note:

### No one is obligated to attend Mass on Sundays.

Everyone in the archdiocese is dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Also, any persons, including clergy, who feel sick, should NOT attend Mass.

**Public Masses will be celebrated again, but only according to the required archdiocesan regulations shown below.**

#### Sunday Mass in Church

Saturday Vigil Mass: 5:30 p.m.

Sunday Morning Masses: 7:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m.

#### Weekday Mass in Church

Monday – Friday only one Mass at 6:30 a.m.

*(The building, including restrooms, etc. must be disinfected after every Mass.)*

Saturday Morning Mass at 8:15 a.m.

#### As we resume public Masses, please note the following:

1. In his letter providing the option to resume public Masses, Archbishop Rodi includes this caution: *“Last Friday [May 8] was the highest number of new cases yet recorded in Alabama in one day. We have not ‘turned the corner.’ This virus remains a deadly danger. Our people are getting sick. Our people are dying. Every parish and every priest must follow these regulations in order to celebrate public Masses. This situation is that serious.”* Any parish unable to fully implement these regulations, must not have public Mass.
2. Seating in the church must be reduced: Some sections of pews will be closed off, and in the sections of pews that are open, only every other pew may be used. In each pew individuals must maintain a distance of 6 feet from one another, unless they are members of the same household.
3. If for a particular Mass the church reaches maximum capacity (according to current guidelines), it may be necessary to refuse entry to arriving parishioners. The archbishop stated: “It is imperative to have a plan, and personnel present at Masses, to limit the number of people entering the church so that social distancing may be maintained.”
4. Pews and common surfaces must be disinfected between Masses. While the disinfecting is taking place, the doors to the church and community center must be locked. The doors will be opened in time for the next Mass.
5. Communion will only be distributed in the hand. Only clergy may distribute Communion, and they must wear masks during distribution of the Eucharist, but not during the rest of the Mass.
6. Hymnals and other shared worship aids may not be used.
7. Offertory baskets may not be passed person to person. Offerings may be placed in the tall wooden collection box at the beginning of the main aisle.
8. There will be no offertory procession.
9. The priests will set-up for Mass. No servers will be necessary.
10. The Sign of Peace may be retained but no physical contact is required.
11. Communicants are to keep social distancing when in the Communion line.
12. People are asked to maintain social distancing when departing.
