MISSIONARY CO-OP PLAN ... You will note that in your envelope packet, there is an envelope for the **Missionary Cooperation Plan** scheduled to take place this weekend (July 27/28). This second collection will **not** take place, but rather on the weekend of August 18/19. At that time, we will have a guest priest from the Maryknoll Society who will speak at all our Masses. Please hold on to your envelopes until that weekend. Thank you for your generosity and understanding.

FIRST FRIDAY ... Friday, August 3, is First Friday at St. Patrick's. If you plan on taking an hour to adore the Blessed Sacrament, please sign up on the sheet provided at the entrance near the sanctuary. There should be at least two people present during the time of exposition. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will be immediately after the 9:00AM Mass and end at 11:00AM with Benediction.

PLANNED GIVING: Capital Campaign ... The Diocesan-wide **It's Our Church, It's Our Future** Capital Campaign will soon be upon us. The Diocese has set a \$16 million goal, which will include \$1.3 million for the 2018 Bishop's Fund Appeal. Of the funds raised, 75% will remain at the Parish for local needs such as programs and capital improvements. The remaining 25% benefits the entire Diocese supporting Retired Priests, Seminarians, Camp Guggenheim and St. Mary's Cathedral. Please prayerfully consider a gift to support our Church of the North Country. Planning will begin in our parish in the coming weeks with the Campaign set to begin in September.

PROTECTION OF HUMAN LIFE ... You are invited to join Catholics nationwide in a weekly moment of prayer from August to late September 2018 for the legal protection of human life. As soon as Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy announced his retirement, pro-abortion groups began lobbying the U.S. Senate to reject any nominee who does not promise to endorse *Roe v. Wade*. We should certainly raise grave concerns about a confirmation process that is being grossly distorted by efforts to subject judicial nominees to a litmus test of support for abortion. And we must pray. Each Friday, from August 3 to September 28, 2018, we'll have the opportunity to join a nine-week effort of prayer, fasting and education that a change in the U.S. Supreme Court will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life. As part of the USCCB Call to Prayer, participants can receive weekly prayer reminders by text message or email. In addition to the current invitation to fast on Fridays, participants will be encouraged to pray one *Our Father*, *Hail Mary*, and *Glory Be* for this intention and will receive important facts about how *Roe* is not health care, is bad law, and fails women.
