Notes from the Pastor's Desk

WELCOME ... A special welcome to Fr. Bill Gordon who will be celebrating our Masses here and at St. Mary's this weekend. It is always a pleasure to have him here.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY ... Next weekend, we will celebrate World Mission Sunday. Its theme this year is "Through Youth to the World: Voices for Mission." Pope Francis addresses his message for the year's celebration to young people by saying to all: "Christians who live the Church adventure of their life as children of God, what leads me to speak to everyone through this conversation with you is the certainty that the Christian Faith remains ever young when it is open to the mission that Christ entrusts to us." Pope Francis invites the entire Church to support the young mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, where priests, religious and lay leaders serve some of the poorest of the poor. Please keep the Missions in your prayers and be generous in next weekend's collection for the Society of the Propagation of the Faith.

PLANNED GIVING: Capital Campaign ... We have begun to receive gifts to our Capital Campaign and we will be able to show you our progress in the coming weeks. Parishioners who were not able to attend one of our receptions will be receiving information about the campaign through the mail. We will also have information in the bulletin and in the church. We have set up a display in the upstairs church lobby for those wishing to read about the campaign now. We ask for your attention, consideration and prayers for the success of the campaign.

2018 BISHOP'S FUND APPEAL ... This year only, we will not be holding the Bishop's Fund Appeal. It will be combined with our Capital Campaign. The goal of our Bishop's Fund Appeal is \$13,061. This amount will be taken from our Capital Campaign and used for the Bishop's Fund Appeal. Of the funds raised after we have met this goal, 75% will be given to the parish for its needs and the remaining 25% will be used for Diocesan needs.
