Notes from the Pastor's Desk

WELCOME ... A special welcome to Msgr. Leeward Poissant who will be celebrating our Masses here and at St. Mary's this weekend. It is a pleasure to have him here.

THIS WEEKEND IS WORLD MISSION SUNDAY ... Today, we take up the second special collection for World Mission Sunday. On this day, Pope Francis calls us to be voices of mission and to speak up through our prayers and sacrifices for our brothers and sisters in the Missions in places where people face uncertainty and violence and where peoples' livelihoods are threatened by climate change and where clergy face martyrdom. Raise your voice today by supporting priests, religious Sisters and Brothers, and lay catechists who provide loving service to those most in need. May you and your faith remain open to the Mission that Christ entrusts in us.
