Notes from the Pastor's Desk

WELCOME ... to Fr. Bill Gordon who will be celebrating the 4:00PM Mass at St. Mary's and the 10:00AM Mass here at St. Patrick's.

THANK YOU ... A huge thank you to Jim and Sue Chenevert for their time and supplies to put no parking lines at our Parish Center as well as the handicap signs in our driveway next to the church. We are very grateful to them for their donation to St. Patrick's.

NO PARKING LINES ... We have just added "No Parking" yellow lines and signs at our Parish Center. The purpose of this is two-fold. Primarily, it is to keep the area in front of the door as well as the sidewalk entrances clear when Christian Formation classes are being held on Sunday mornings from 8:15AM to 10:00AM. We need a clear, safe area for children and parents to be able to access the building for pick up and drop off. We hope you will be mindful of this parking situation during that time. Secondly, this will also help to keep the back door entrance clear during weekday mornings when the Nutrition Site needs to be able to load their vehicles for meal delivery.
