Notes from the Pastor's Desk

WELCOME BACK TO ALL OUR PARISHIONERS ... St. Patrick's and St. Mary's Churches are now reopened for weekend and daily Masses. We were pleased to see all who have come back and hope to see more of you as the week's progress. Even though there is limited seating, we are able to seat 91 parishioners in our church and 45 in our parish hall. Because of the low numbers who have come so far, seating has not been too much of an issue. Please keep in mind that as the numbers increase, it will be necessary for the assigned seats to be enforced so that the required social distancing is maintained. We also ask that everyone wear a mask. We hope everyone will understand and comply with the rules that are necessary so that we can remain safe and healthy.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION Please come to Communion using the main aisle. Parishioners should alternate exiting their pews from side to side and forming a single line in the middle of the aisle while maintaining 6 feet social distancing. Once the center pews are empty, those in the side pews may cross to the middle aisle as well. After receiving Communion, you should exit the church and not return to your pew.

NO FIRST FRIDAY AT EITHER PARISH ... Due to our parish restrictions at this time, we will not have First Friday Exposition and Benediction at St. Mary's or St. Patrick's.

WHEN VISITING OUR CHURCH ... We ask that those of you who come to visit our church during the week for Mass or just to pray, please use the hand sanitizer which is located at both church entrances. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

CONGRATULATIONS ... to all our graduating seniors and college graduates. Although this past few months have been a very different and difficult time, we still wish you much success in all their future endeavors. Congratulations also to all our other students who have completed another year of studies. May they have an enjoyable summer and be ready and refreshed for the coming school year.

CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS

ST. PATRICK'S CEMETERY ... Flowers may be planted in front of monuments, preferably protected by paving stones, not to exceed 15 inches from the front of the monument foundation. (These paving stones can be placed in a straight or curved fashion, but must not exceed the 15 inches allowed). Perennials will be permitted on lots, but their height may not be more than 15 inches and they must be within the 15-inch boundary in front of the foundation. As we have said in the past and continue to reiterate, artificial flowers may be placed on the monuments only and are not permitted in the ground. Artificial flowers are considered "on the monument" if they are in an appropriate (durable) pot that touches the monument or are of a size that can be placed on the monument foundation. Artificial flowers placed in the ground are an insurance liability and also a hazard for those moving and working in the cemetery. If they are placed in the ground, they will be removed. Also, please do not place any glass containers on the lots as they may break and cause damage to cemetery equipment and personnel.

ST. JOSEPH'S CEMETERY ... Flowers, flags, etc. will be permitted on the ground only on Memorial Day and must be removed by the third day after the holiday. The rest of the year they will be permitted only on the monuments and out of the way for mowing of the grass. No permanent flowers are to be planted.

Cost for opening of grave: \$500 for full burial, \$150 for cremation
Cost for each cemetery lot, including endowed care: \$400
