RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION Please come to Communion using the main aisle. Parishioners should alternate exiting their pews from side to side and forming a **single line in the middle of the aisle** while maintaining 6 feet social distancing. Once the center pews are empty, those in the side pews should walk to the back of the church and come up the main aisle as well. When arriving at the front, please go to the priest or Eucharistic Minister who is on the side where you were sitting so that you can easily return to your pew. Those who are not able to come to Communion should remain in their seats and a Eucharistic Minister will bring Communion to them.

DIRECTIVE FROM THE DIOCESE OF OGDENSBURG ... Due to the increasing number of COVID-19 infections, we ask that our parishioners, age 2 and older, wear masks or cloth face coverings during Masses (except for when receiving Holy Communion) to decrease the spread of airborne droplets and the subsequent risk of transmission. Wearing face coverings is a risk-reduction measure that permits as many people as possible to attend Mass in person. In particular, this helps guard against transmitting the virus to the elderly and immunocompromised members of the congregation and to those who assist in their care. We appreciate your cooperation with this request.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION ... On Tuesday, one of our parishioners tested positive for COVID-19. This parishioner attended the funeral at St. Patrick's on Wednesday, December 30 and the New Year's Eve Mass at St. Mary's, but has not been back to either parish since. We clean and sanitize both our churches after each Mass in accordance with recommendations of the New York State Department of Health and CDC guidelines. Protocols are still in place with mask wearing and hand sanitizing. We have not been told any new directives from the health department, but we feel that it is our duty to let our parishioners have this information.

Please protect yourself and others:

- Stay home if you are sick. Separate yourself from others, monitor your symptoms and contact your healthcare provider.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a mask. Everyone (ages 2 and older) should wear and mask in public settings and when around people who don't live your household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.
- Practice physical distancing. Put distance between yourself and other people outside of your home. Stay at least 6 feet (about two arms' length) from other people. Do not gather in groups and stay out of crowded places.
- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds frequently. If soap and water are not readily available, use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue or use the inside of your elbow.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces often.

Please note that hand sanitizers are available for use by parishioners at all church entrances.
