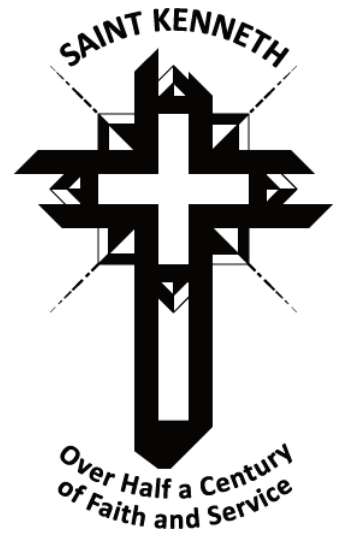


WELCOME TO SAINT KENNETH!
