**MEDITATION
ON TODAY'S READINGS
Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

He became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. (2 Corinthians 8:9)

If you've ever pondered what heaven might be like, you may have thought of a summer day: the bloom of the flowers, the warmth of the sun, God's creation bursting with life. Who would ever want to leave such a beautiful place? And yet this is what Jesus did when he left heaven to come and save us.

St. Paul explains why Jesus made such a sacrifice: "So that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Jesus took on the "poverty" of our human limitations so that we could inherit the richness of eternal life. He entered so fully into our poverty, in fact, that he endured death—all so that we could live forever.

Now, because of Jesus' sacrifice, you can receive his riches every single day. But how? Today's Gospel shows us the way. Both Jairus and the hemorrhaging woman knew they were in desperate circumstances and that they needed the healing that only Jesus could provide. Similarly, when we acknowledge our spiritual poverty, we open our hearts to receive Jesus' riches.

So confess your weaknesses and your sins to the Lord. Acknowledge the temptations that always seem to trip you up. Tell Jesus that you *need* him.

Yet Jairus and the hemorrhaging woman didn't just admit their poverty. They also believed in the riches of Jesus' love. Their faith opened a way for his divine power to flow. Likewise, when you confess your neediness to the Lord, you can be confident that he will fill you—not with material wealth, but with the riches of his presence, his forgiveness, and his wisdom.

Jesus' poverty has won you untold riches—riches that are available to you in a special way in Holy Communion. So come to him in poverty and humility and faith. Come and let him fill you.

"Lord, thank you for becoming poor to make me rich! Thank you, Jesus, for your love!"

My name is Fr. Stefan, and I am thrilled to be able to walk together with you on this faith journey, following our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, as His disciples here at Epiphany Parish. My first day with you will be July 7th.

As Msgr. Jameson indicated, I was born and raised in Germany. My whole family is still there. I discerned my call to the priesthood while I was in the United States for six months, doing research for my Ph.D. During that time, I traveled to Washington, D.C., Missouri, and Kansas, and had a great time. I met many wonderful people, and was deeply moved and impressed by the way they lived their faith so actively and dynamically.

I decided to study for the priesthood, and was accepted by the Archdiocese of Washington. I went to Saint John Paul II Seminary, followed by Theological College, both in Washington, D.C. Since my ordination to the priesthood in 2019, I have served for the last two years as Parochial Vicar at St. Elizabeth Church in Rockville, Maryland. Because of my heritage, I am also involved with the Hungarian Catholic Community here in the Diocese.

I want to express my gratitude to Msgr. Jameson, for all of his hard work and dedication as Interim Administrator, after the sudden death of your beloved Pastor, Msgr. Mosley.

Please keep me in your prayers as I get started, and know that I also pray for all of you. Through the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary, may the Lord continue to bless our parish and the wonderful work that is done here.

LIFTING OF THE DISPENSATION FROM THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS

Cardinal Gregory and the Archdiocese of Washington have announced that the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Day Mass obligation will be lifted beginning on Saturday, June 26, 2021 and Sunday, June 27, 2021.
