THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

I was reading over again recently an article by Carl Anderson, the Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus that was published in Crux on November 7, 2016. Mr. Anderson states that the question we as Catholics should ask ourselves is in what way Catholics in America can be a source of unity and reconciliation in the future or will we be a cause of further division? He believes that it is time for more and not less Catholic involvement in the life of our nation. He bases this on a suggestion made by Pope Francis that we strive to live more fully by the criteria that the Lord commands rather than by the criteria of the world. To this end Mr. Anderson believes that we need to continue the renewal of our own faith community as Catholics if we are to have any hope of influencing more effectively our national life as Americans. He suggests that the renewal of our faith community develop in at least six ways:

- 1. We need to continue the renewal of parish life as a true Eucharistic community with a fuller appreciation of how the "source and summit of Christian life" is also the source and summit of our unity and charity as Christians.
- 2. The evangelization of Catholic families as a domestic church which, like the universal church, is called to reach out in solidarity to other families, as a source of unity, charity, mercy and reconciliation.
- 3. A renewed devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary not only as the perfect model of the Christian life, but also as an unsurpassed model for understanding our responsibilities as citizens for the common good.
- 4. We need to have a deeper understanding of those moral principles and issues that have "absolute value" (as Pope Francis has said the Fifth Commandment does) for us as a faith community, and that are the basis for a more adequate engagement with the social doctrine of our church.
- 5. We need to have a heightened commitment to Catholic education that is not simply abstract, but one that seeks to form the entire person.
- 6. We need to have a greater appreciation of the office of bishop as a source of unity for the local Church—a unity that promotes a deeper communion among bishops, priests, religious, and laity.

Mr. Anderson concludes his reflection by stating that if we begin to pursue these six goals, the resulting greater unity among Catholics may provide a roadmap for greater unity for our entire country. That would be indeed a very good thing to happen.

Finally, let me wish everyone a *Happy Thanksgiving*. I pray that those who are traveling over the weekend will arrive at their destinations safely and return safely as well!
