THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

Eight days ago we had the twentieth anniversary of that awful day when nearly 3,000 people died in the attacks on the World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and the plane crash in Shanksville, PA. Last Sunday about forty parishioners attended a Prayer Service here in which we reflected on Scripture, and prayed for special groups of people during a period of intercessory prayer. It was a very moving night for me, especially since I have ministered to families who lost someone at 9/11 in three of the parishes in which I have been assigned. For them 9/11 is always a sad and painful day of remembrance.

In the course of our Prayer Service to mark the twentieth anniversary of 9/11, we remembered Carol Ann La Plante, the sister of parishioner Jeanne Kavinski, who was working on the 97th floor of the North Tower of the World Trade Center that fateful morning. We also read the names of the eleven residents of Montgomery County who were killed that day: William E. Caswell, Gerald P. Fisher, Lawrence Daniel Getzfred, Michele Heidenberger, Angela Marie Houtz, Teddington H. Moy, Lieutenant Darin Howard Pontell, Scott A. Powell, Todd Hayes Reuben, Patricia J. Statz, and Ernest M. Willcher.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace! May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

I also want to share with you comments made by Archbishop Jose Gomez, the archbishop of Los Angeles, who is also the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. These are remarks he made on the eve of the twentieth anniversary of the September 11 terrorist attacks:

"As we remember the twentieth anniversary of September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, our hearts are with all those who lost loved ones on that day. We pray for the innocent lives that were lost, and we pray for those who grieve, and for the many who still bear the wounds from these attacks, physical, emotional and spiritual.

"It was a dark day of destruction and death, but remember also the heroes—first-responders, firefighters, police, emergency medical and rescue teams. Many gave their lives in the service of their neighbors. This violence, borne of the worst evil in the human heart, also brought the best in our humanity. We think today of the courage and generosity of countless ordinary people and the spirit of unity and authentic patriotism we saw in the days after these attacks.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM NEWS: GROUP A ELEMENTARY CLASSES AND ALL MIDDLE SCHOOL CLASSES START THIS WEEK!

Calendars are posted to the parish website, and are also being mailed to all who have registered. We look forward to welcoming families to this year's two program options:

Option 1: "Homeschool model" with parents teaching their children at home with textbook resources and support provided by the parish, including 7 online parent meetings and additional events for students and families. **Our first online parent meeting was held last Sunday, September 12. Parents who missed this meeting can contact the religious education office to receive a recorded version of the presentation. If you have not already done so, please be sure to pick up materials for the Homeschool Option from the Church Gathering Space as soon as possible.**

OR

Option 2: "Classroom model" with children attending in-person classes with modifications in place to comply with covid safety protocols (including keeping 3 ft. distance in classrooms, required use of face masks, and frequent hand washing/sanitizing). In-person classes for Kindergarten through Grade 8 will be offered as follows:

- **Elementary (Kindergarten-Grade 5) classes with students attending class in person on alternating weeks and completing a lesson at-home between each in-person class.** Two Elementary session times will be offered: Sunday morning, 9:20-10:35 am and Monday afternoon, 4:45-6:00 pm. **Group A classes start today and Monday, Sept. 19/20. Group B classes start next week, Sept. 26/27.**
- **Middle School (Grade 6, 7 & 8) classes with students attending weekly.** Two Middle School session times will be offered: Monday and Tuesday evenings, 6:45-8:00 pm. **Classes start this Monday and Tuesday, Sept. 20/21.**
- **Classes for children and youth with special needs will continue to be offered via Zoom meeting on Sunday afternoons 3:30-4:30 pm. Classes begin today, Sept. 19.**

Children must be registered before they can begin classes. Space is still available in most classes and children are welcome to start classes once registration is received and processed. Find registration forms on the parish web site (www.sfadw.org), in the Church Gathering Space, and in the Parish Office. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Completed forms can be mailed to the parish, dropped off in person at the Rectory Office (Monday-Friday, 8 am-4 pm), or returned as digital copies via email to sfareligioused@sfadw.org. Questions? At minimum, children are expected to have participated in religious education in the year prior to preparing for a sacrament. *Please note: students preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation will attend their grade-level Religious Education classes as well as monthly Confirmation sessions.*

Families requesting sacramental preparation for their child are asked to mark their registration form accordingly so that additional information can be provided. Please note that there is a separate materials fee for sacramental preparation programs. More details will be provided at the parent meetings next year.
