St. Peter's Parish Mission Statement

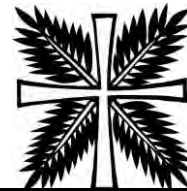



Update on Chrism Mass, where we receive the Holy Oils used for certain Sacraments for the coming year~ from Archbishop Mulhall:

Given the restrictions on travel between the different colour zones, it has been decided that the Mass of Chrism will be celebrated privately at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception on Holy Thursday, 1 April 2021, with just the Cathedral staff in attendance. Holy Oils will be distributed to the parishes afterwards.

Good Friday Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Good Friday. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to observe the laws of fast on Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day

Divine Mercy ~ Plenary Indulgence

Fri., April 2 ~ Divine Mercy Novena begins. Pamphlets containing instructions for the chaplet of Divine Mercy and for the Divine Mercy Novena are available in the Church foyer.

Sun., April 11, 3-4pm ~ Divine Mercy Holy Hour. The Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. To ensure that Catholics would observe this day with special devotion, St. (Pope) John Paul II enriched this day with a plenary indulgence and directed that priests should promote this devotion among the faithful. An indulgence is a remission before God of temporal punishment due to sin. On Divine Mercy Sunday, a plenary indulgence (a total remission of temporal punishment) is granted to the faithful who: (1) go to Confession (within 20 days), (2) receive Holy Communion, (3) pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, (4) take part in the parish prayers and devotions held in honour of the Divine Mercy on this day, and (5) have no attachment to sin. The Divine Mercy devotion originated with Sister Faustina Kowalska who had a vision of the Divine Mercy and received special promises from Jesus.
