Divine Mercy ~ Plenary Indulgence

Sun., April 11, 3–4pm ~ Divine Mercy Holy Hour. The Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. To ensure that Catholics would observe this day with special devotion, St. (Pope) John Paul II enriched this day with a plenary indulgence and directed that priests should promote this devotion among the faithful. An indulgence is a remission before God of temporal punishment due to sin. On Divine Mercy Sunday, a plenary indulgence (a total remission of temporal punishment) is granted to the faithful who: (1) go to Confession (within 20 days), (2) receive Holy Communion, (3) pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, (4) take part in the parish prayers and devotions held in honour of the Divine Mercy on this day, and (5) have no attachment to sin.

Divine Mercy Sunday Facts & Quotes



St. Faustina was a Polish nun who lived in the early 20th century. She devoted her life to spreading the word about God's forgiveness, or divine mercy, for anyone who asks for forgiveness. Although she was a mystic, she also cooked and gardened as part of her convent life.

St. Faustina had visions much of her life. One that was the most profound was of Jesus, with one hand raised in blessing and with two fingers of his other hand resting on his heart. She said that Jesus asked her to have the image painted, and to include a prayer that said, "Jesus, I trust in you." This is the prayer that Catholics recite on Divine Mercy Sunday.

Most priests preach on the story of Doubting Thomas on Divine Mercy Sunday (John 20:19-31). Thomas, also a saint in the Roman Catholic Church, was one Jesus' apostles. When Jesus arose from the dead, Thomas didn't believe it. Jesus directed Thomas to touch his crucifixion wounds to help him believe. Jesus didn't chastise Thomas for his disbelief, which is considered an act of mercy.
