


St. John's Bible Information before Province Conference



Abbey Church Tours

The Abbey Church is open daily from before 7 a.m. Morning Prayer to about 10 p.m. Visitors are welcome to tour on their own at any time except during Masses, prayer services, and other events. A **complimentary "Self-Guided Tour"** leaflet is available near the baptistry (the main entrance) and a more-detailed booklet can be purchased from the Abbey Gift Shop just inside the Great Hall or from the university bookstore in the Sexton Commons student center.

Groups of six or more may request a guided tour given by a monk. These typically last an hour but can be shortened if needed. **The offering is \$5 per adult and \$2 per child under 12.** Please pay your monk guide with cash or check. The preferred time for guided tours is 1:30 p.m. on weekdays.

The Saint John's Bible Gallery

Located in the lower level of Alcuin Library, directly opposite the abbey church.

Regular Hours: **Monday – Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.** Saturdays (starting October 21) from noon to 4 p.m. (**Saturday Hours will only be during the months of June through the week before Christmas.** There are no weekend hours in January through May.) Sundays: Closed.

The gallery is open during the above hours for self-guided tours. Generous patrons insure there is never an admission charge to see the gallery.
