Baptism

Every Weekend after Mass on request. Baptismal preparation classes are the first Saturday of every month at 10:00 a.m. in the classrooms above the church. Please call the rectory in advance to schedule class attendance and Baptism.

Sponsors

Parishioners need to meet with Msgr. Koons to determine whether they are eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Please call the rectory.

Marriage

Please call the rectory at least one year in advance to schedule a wedding. Attendance at diocesan Marriage Preparation Classes is required six months prior to the wedding date, as well as three or four sessions with the priest. Current Baptism and Confirmation certificates are needed for the Catholic parties. In the case of previously existing marriages, a death certificate or declaration of nullity is necessary before another marriage can be considered.

Parish Registration

New parishioners are always welcome and are asked to register at the rectory. Please notify the rectory if you change your address, phone number, or move out of the parish.

Communion to the Sick

Communion is taken to the sick after the Sunday Masses and during the month. The Anointing of the Sick is celebrated with individual homebound parishioners several times a year or at your request. Please call the rectory to request being included on the homebound Communion list.

Please call the rectory when parishioners are admitted to a local hospital.

**Wednesday Eucharistic Adoration - Tuesday Bible Study
Telephone Ministry**

Dear Parishioners of Assumption BVM:

During our priest convocation at the beginning of November, Bishop Schlert requested that parishes institute a period of Eucharistic Adoration on a weekly basis. Here in our parish, we have had Eucharistic Adoration on the First Fridays of the month. It has been an opportunity of grace and prayer that I will extend, at the Bishop's recommendation, to a weekly basis. **Beginning Wednesday, December 2, 2020, which is the First Week of Advent, Wednesday morning Mass will continue into Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, and conclude with Benediction at 9:15AM.** This will enable those who stay to make a "holy hour" before the exposed Blessed Sacrament; we will have a period of prayer and a period of silence during that hour. Please consider joining in prayer at Mass and adoration afterwards. The Mass and Exposition/Benediction will be livestreamed to our Facebook page. *Adoration on Wednesday mornings will continue throughout the year. First Friday adoration will also continue.* In these uncertain times, seeking the Lord in the Holy Eucharist, the "source and summit" of our faith, will provide an opportunity to "rest in Him" and take to Him in prayer our cares and concerns, our hopes and joys. Please consider taking this opportunity to grow in friendship with our Eucharistic Lord.

ALSO: This past August, the Sisters of Christian Charity have found a new home at Queenship of Mary Convent. One of the sisters of the community, Sister Donna Brady, S.C.C., has offered her time and talents to our parish. Sister would like to initiate a Bible Study on *Tuesday mornings in our Social Hall at 8:45am*, after the morning Mass. The Bible Study is not a structured program, but rather, Sister invites themes from the participants to read/discuss each week. **Sister will begin our group on Tuesday, December 1 at 8:45am.** She also conducts a bible group at Queenship of Mary on Tuesdays at 7pm. You are most welcome to attend either group. Sister Donna also conducts a group on Thursday evenings at 7pm at Queenship to work on wood crafts. Books and samples are provided for each person to choose which craft he/she would like to paint. Sister does the "cutting" and has the wood crafts ready to paint for the next week's session. You are welcome to attend at Queenship, **and if there is interest, we could have a morning session at our parish on Thursday mornings in our Social Hall. Please let the Rectory know of your interest for a morning session.**

ASLO: Sister Donna will be starting a 'phone ministry' to our shut-ins during this time of isolation, which has been particularly difficult for the elderly. She will also be making communion calls in the near future. If you know of any elderly person who would appreciate a phone call from Sister, 'just to talk,' please let us know.

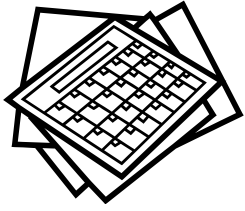
