A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Today we celebrate the love of God and the friendship we have in his Son, Jesus Christ. We are called to be love as the Father and the Son are love. We are in the circle of their friendship along with the Holy Spirit. This dynamic relationship, which includes particular behaviors as commanded by the commandments given by Christ, allows us to be included in the humanity of Christ here on earth.

Today we look to see what love the Father has for us and we see the invitation to those receiving for the very first time the precious gift of life in Christ through the Sacrament of His Body and Blood. We are nourished not by bread and wine but rather by what has been transfigured by the Word and made into what we can consume, a new reality of perceived bread and wine but now the Body and Blood of Christ.

We, as believing people, can trust that when Christ says something that it is undeniably true. The Scriptures tell us that Jesus spoke the words of consecration and turned bread and wine into his Body and Blood. We are grateful for this gift of nourishment – for what we eat we may become. Jesus, in loving us, loves the Father in heaven, for what the Father created is not taken for granted and the human person is the pinnacle of creation, the greatest form that can relate to God in His Son.

We are a people called to imitate what love the Son has for the Father. We are to respect the human form as it was truly intended – to be worthy of holiness, to be worthy as a throne for God Himself.

Those receiving their First Eucharist today exemplify the beauty of what Christ says when he tells his disciples, "Let the children come to me". Children come to receive what they need most in their lives – the bread that will sustain them in their journey to heaven. They give thanks to God for their ability to humbly take part in the Lord's Supper and the meal that takes place in heaven, the supper of the Lamb.

Revelation speaks to us of our liturgy that is eternal and our need to be present to such a spectacle and to be fed at such a meal. We are truly grateful for the weekly opportunity to be fed by Word and Sacrament, to be challenged to love more perfectly as we grow in stature and virtue. Our gratitude turns into the generosity to avail ourselves to God on His day, to make Him our priority as we honor His Son and become another Christ to our neighbor.

Let us live as Eucharistic people, thankful for what Christ has done for us, remembering to Love as Christ Loved us.
