A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Today we are encouraged by the Scriptures that speak of the Prophet Elijah's strengthening by eating the food that was provided by an angel. We, like Elijah, are encouraged by the Word of God and through His instruction that we may persevere and have success throughout our journey. We come to believe in the One who made us and the One who calls us from ourselves to Himself. Let us nourish ourselves on He who is the Bread of Life and as we eat this bread knowingly consume what our nature is holiness – union with God.
