## A REFLECTION ON THE WORD...

The word at home: A welcome message



Some friends gave my wife and me a welcome mat that had the words from today's first reading on it for our 10<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." When we first got this gift, I was too embarrassed to put it on display at our front door. I didn't want to look like a "holy roller" or a hypocrite. I knew how often I fell short of that stated intention. There were plenty of times I was pleased to just serve myself.

Then I realized that the ones who would most often see the words on that mat were my family and me. We were the ones who traipsed in and out that door several times a day. And, so for years, until it was worn beyond usefulness, we were greeted morning and evening, and often several times a day with the reminder that it was our stated intention to serve the Lord. And when people would come to our house, that saying nudged me to be a better, more gracious host, welcoming both visitors and strangers not only on my own behalf, but in the name of the Lord.

It was a subtle message, often overlooked, but one that offered a steady reminder of the daily need to decide who I align myself with and what I hope to do in my life and in my home.

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME By Invitation Only

Too often we speak of faith as an obligation, when it's an invitation. Churches have some of the biggest doors around, and they open both ways. We can come and go—and plenty of people do both, at one time or another. When teachings are challenging, folks may find discipleship unacceptable—just like in the time of Jesus. We don't arrive here by mandate, and we're not prisoners of our Baptism. Come if you will, leave if you choose. But if you stay, be clear on where the path of Jesus is going, and what it will cost.

## TURN YOUR CAR INTO A MONASTERY

"What is prayer? Saint John of Damascus said, "Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God." When someone asked Thomas Merton to reveal the one thing he should do to improve his prayer life, Merton responded: "Take the time." One thing I often recommend is praying in the car (or in the subway, bus, train, etc.) For those of us distracted by a thousand things, and who are constantly on the move, the car can be a bit like a monastic cell. It encloses

you within a quiet, meditative space conducive to prayer. Also, as an added bonus, when you treat your car as a monastery, traffic becomes a welcome opportunity for more prayer and silence, rather than a cause of frustration. Turn your car into a monastery!"

This September, Caroline County, in partnership with Drug-Free Caroline and other community stakeholders, will be launching "Caroline Goes Purple," a month-long project to build awareness of the critical opioid epidemic facing our community. Overdoses are the leading cause of accidental death for those under age 50. In fact, overdoses kill more people each year than car accidents and homicides combined. Join the movement by doing one of the following:

- Go Purple! Light your home with purple lights.
- Spread the word! Share education messages on social media.
- Talk about it! Engage in conversation with your family about prescription drugs, and really listen to what your kids have to say.
- Take action! Lock up your prescription drugs and safely dispose of ones you aren't using.
- Join the conversation! Attend one of the community conversations about the opioid crisis.

## SENIOR CALL CHECK PILOT PROGRAM

Maryland is the first state in the country to start a free, opt-in, telephonic service to check on Maryland's older residents across the state. Every day a telephone call will be placed to a participant at a regularly scheduled time. These calls will take place between 8am and 4pm. If the participant does not answer after three calls, additional calls will be made to notify a designated person. Any Maryland resident aged 65 or older who has a land line or cell phone is eligible to participate. To apply, please call 1-800-243-3425 or visit [www.aging.maryland.gov](http://www.aging.maryland.gov). You will be informed if your application is accepted for the Pilot Program.
