

A WORD FROM FR. BENDEN

In the reading today from Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he says that "eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it dawned upon humans what God has in store for him in heaven." This has always been one of my favorite quotes from Sacred Scripture. Paul is trying to help us understand that God is so much bigger than us that we cannot in any way fathom his greatness. I have thought about this quote a lot over the years. What does it mean to be infinite? It is really beyond our comprehension because everything we see in this life is finite. We see things born that die. We see things new that become old. How can God be always new, never growing old? How can there be a God who has always been, and not had a beginning?

As you know, I have a jar of sand on my desk that represents God to me. I suppose this jar would have to be an infinite jar to really contain God, but this jar is enough for me. When I hear about this quote from St. Paul today I am reminded of the infinite greatness of God. We have no idea of the great things that will be shone to us in heaven because we are not God. What will heaven be like? I have no idea. Really. I have no idea. The jar of sand on my desk represents God to me but it also represents the infinite variety of different days that God might give to us in heaven. In this life, every day is pretty much the same. There are a few different things that might happen, but the same sorts of things happen here every day. Now what if God was to give us a different type of day each day in heaven. I don't mean to say a different day, but a different type of day. What if, instead of collecting money like we do on earth, we collected smiles from other people. And these smiles from others gave us the most intense amount of pleasure, like nothing we have ever experienced before. We might be tempted to say, "My goodness, why didn't I ever have that same feeling of a smile on earth. The answer is because it is earth is not heaven. We are never going to experience the same kind of pleasure on earth that we will in heaven. Those are things that God will provide when the time is right.

Many people fear death, or the loss of something we have on earth, but with FAITH we realize that nothing can compare to the infinite riches that God has prepared for us in the next life. God is infinite, and therefore, can give us an infinite amount of things in the next life that can't compare in the least to anything in this life. If we only had faith the size of a mustard seed, God would supply the rest.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Valentine
Feast Day: February 14th

Valentine was a holy priest in Rome, who, with St. Marius and his family, assisted the martyrs in the persecution under Claudius II. He was apprehended, and sent by the emperor to the prefect of Rome, who, on finding all his promises to make him renounce his faith ineffectual, commanded him to be beaten with clubs, and afterwards, to be beheaded, which was executed on February 14, about the year 270.

Pope Julius I is said to have built a church near Ponte Mole to his memory, which for a long time gave name to the gate now called Porta del Popolo, formerly, Porta Valetini. The greatest part of his relics are now in the church of St. Praxedes. His name is celebrated as that of an illustrious martyr in the sacramentary of St. Gregory, the Roman Missal of Thomasius, in the calendar of F. Fronto and that of Allatius, in Bede, Usuard, Ado, Notker and all other martyrologies on this day. To abolish the heathens lewd superstitious custom of boys drawing the names of girls, in honor of their goddess Februata Juno, on the fifteenth of this month, several zealous pastors substituted the names of saints in billets given on this day.

St. Valentine was martyred in 269 at Rome and was buried on the Flaminian Way. He is the Patron Saint of affianced couples, bee keepers, engaged couples, epilepsy, fainting, greetings, happy marriages, love, lovers, plague, travelers, and young people.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Sister Thea Bowman was born in Yazoo, Mississippi and grew up to be a renowned Roman Catholic nun, teacher and scholar. Born Methodist, she became Catholic when she was nine years old. She became the first African American to join the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in Wisconsin. After 16 years of teaching, she was invited to be a special consultant for the Catholic church. She gave presentations around the country aimed at bridging racial and cultural divisions. She combined her gifts of singing and gospel preaching, with prayers and storytelling. Sr. Thea was diagnosed with bone cancer in 1984. Yet, she continued her fight against the evils that drive people apart, until her death at age 53 in 1990. Sr. Thea Bowman said she prayed “to live until I die – to live fully.” And that she did.
