The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today's Reading: Dt 8:2-3, 14b-16a; Ps 147:12-13, 14-15, 19-20; 1 Cor 10:16-17; Jn 6:51-58

Manna in the desert, water from a rock, bread, wine. God provides food to nourish our bodies and our souls, to bring us into union with the Divine. This is what we celebrate on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The Israelites who journeyed through the desert for forty years knew physical hunger, but they were also hungry for more—they needed to know that God was with them as they made their way through the dangerous desert. We too experience hunger. We need to be assured that the Lord is with us as we navigate the circumstances of our lives, some of which feel dangerous, if not to our bodies, certainly to our spirit. Our participation in the Eucharist provides this assurance and more: fed with Christ's Body and Blood, we are drawn into communion with Christ and one another.

Food for the Journey

The Israelites who journeyed through the desert were fleeing slavery and certain death. But along the way, they encountered serpents and scorpions and experienced great hunger and thirst. God fed them with manna and quenched their thirst with water drawn from a rock. In these miraculous encounters, the people came to believe that God was truly with them on their journey, and with this assurance, grew to rely on and put their trust in God. Jesus began his ministry with a

pilgrimage to the desert, where he prayed and placed his trust in his heavenly Father. Strengthened at God's hand, Jesus stayed true to his mission even in the face of cruel death, giving himself, his very life and substance to us in bread and wine at the Last Supper and for his disciples for ages unending.

What is your Desert?

Chances are you are not physically wandering in a desert, although millions of people throughout the world live without adequate clean water. All of us experience spiritual and emotional deserts, however. The food that Jesus gives in the Eucharist, his very Body and Blood, soul and divinity, nourish us in our desert moments and strengthen us to live as Christ's people in the world. Partaking in Christ's Body and Blood, we are to live as Christ's people in the world, standing in solidarity with those who are in deserts of their own—physical, spiritual, and emotional. We are called to act as Christ's body, nourishing others through our presence, prayer, and sharing. What is your desert? How does the Eucharist strengthen you as you journey through this dark and sometimes frightening place in life? What deserts of others are you called to address through your caring and sharing as a member of Christ's body, the Church?

Here are the new guideline procedures:

1. Masks are required at all times while inside the church.
2. Body temperature will be checked before entering the church.
3. Seating inside the church adheres to the social distancing of six feet.
4. Hand sanitizing is required.
5. You will remain in your assigned seat at all times- no roaming around the church.
6. High-risk individuals-those 65 years and older, who are immunocompromised or who have underlying health conditions- should stay at home.
7. Maintain physical distancing (6 feet apart).

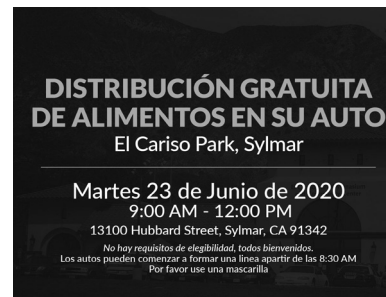
Estos son los nuevos procedimientos orientadores:

¿Sabía Usted?

Esté consciente de los peligros de envenenamiento en el hogar

Más del 90 por ciento de los envenenamientos ocurren en el hogar. Los padres de familia deben saber cuáles son los mayores riesgos que corren los niños (¡especialmente los niños que ponen objetos en su boca!) y trabajar para erradicarlos. El primero en la lista es el envenenamiento por plomo, especialmente en las casas antiguas donde se ha usado pintura o polvos a base de plomo. Las baterías de botones (redondas y planas) son pequeñas y brillantes, muy usadas en muchos juguetes y aparatos electrónicos regados por la casa. Tragarse una de estas puede ser fatal para los niños. Lo mismo ocurre con los líquidos limpiadores que se usan en la casa, como los detergentes empaquetados en pequeñas burbujas de plástico que se usan para lavar la ropa o los platos.
