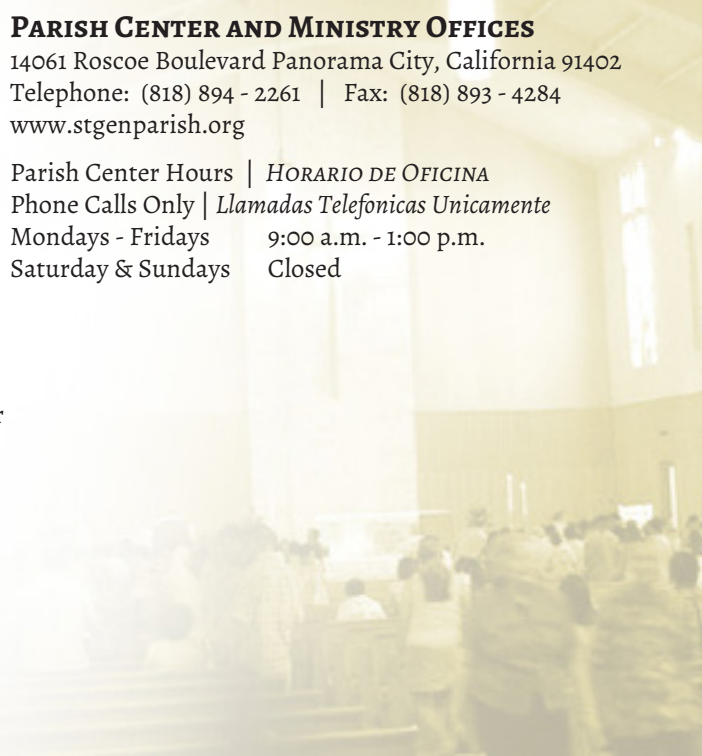

## Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Reading: Jer 20:10–13; Ps 69:8–10, 14, 17, 33–35; Rom 5:12–15; Mt 10:26–33

The psalmist cries out to God, "Lord, in your great love, answer me."

In each of our readings today, there is movement from darkness and despair to trusting in God as our source of salvation. Jeremiah sounds almost a madman as he describes the evil and vileness that surrounds him. In the midst of that terror, he professes his faith in God. Similarly, in Saint Paul's letter to the Romans, we are reminded that one man, Jesus Christ, came into the world for the sake of many, to overcome the evil and sin that have been prevalent since Adam. In Mark, Jesus calls us from fear, sin, and darkness to live in the light. He reminds us that we are not alone and how very precious each of us is in the eyes of God. Indeed, God hears our cries!

### Do not be afraid

In our world today, it seems there are many things to make us fearful. We can become distraught over personal finances, relationships, poor choices our children are making, issues with jobs, the changing climate, the way our parish is being run, or a zillion other things. The problems may not even be evil but may be simply life and all its challenges. But these struggles are real, and sometimes we seek unhealthy solutions. Many people suffer with issues of anxiety and depression, and fear leads others to addiction as a means of coping. In our Gospel today, God lovingly calls us beyond that darkness to light.

### What is your Desert?

Chances are you are not physically wandering in a desert, although millions of people throughout the world live without adequate clean water. All of us experience spiritual and emotional deserts, however. The food that Jesus gives in the Eucharist, his very Body and Blood, soul and divinity, nourish us in our desert moments and strengthen us to live as Christ's people in the world. Partaking in Christ's Body and Blood, we are to live as Christ's people in the world, standing in solidarity with those who are in deserts of their own—physical, spiritual, and emotional. We are called to act as Christ's body, nourishing others through our presence, prayer, and sharing. What is your desert? How does the Eucharist strengthen you as you journey through this dark and sometimes frightening place in life? What deserts of others are you called to address through your caring and sharing as a member of Christ's body, the Church?

Here are the new guideline procedures:

1. Masks are required at all times while inside the church.
2. Body temperature will be checked before entering the church.
3. Seating inside the church adheres to the social distancing of six feet.
4. Hand sanitizing is required.
5. You will remain in your assigned seat at all times- no roaming around the church.
6. High-risk individuals-those 65 years and older, who are immunocompromised or who have underlying health conditions- should stay at home.
7. Maintain physical distancing (6 feet apart).

## Did you Know?

### *Be aware of poison dangers in the home*

More than 90% of all poisonings happen in homes. Parents should know the top risks for children (especially children who still put things in their mouths!) and work to eradicate them. Lead poisoning is high on the list, especially for older homes with lead paint or dust. Button batteries are small and shiny and lurk in many toys and electronics that litter our homes. # Duodécimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

¡No tengas miedo!

En nuestro mundo actual, parece que hay muchas cosas que nos hacen temerosos. Podemos ponernos angustiados por nuestras finanzas personales, relaciones, decisiones mediocres que nuestros hijos hacen, problemas en el trabajo, el cambio climático, la manera en que nuestra parroquia es administrada o un millón de otras cosas. Los problemas quizá ni siquiera son malos, sino que solo es la vida y todos sus cambios. Pero estas dificultades son auténticas y algunas veces buscamos soluciones malsanas. Muchas personas sufren problemas de ansiedad y depresión, y la angustia lleva a otras hacia la adicción como una forma de enfrentarlas. En el Evangelio de hoy, Dios amorosamente nos llama de la oscuridad profunda a la luz.

**Eres más valioso que los pájaros**

Algunas veces buscamos respuestas complejas cuando una solución simple está frente a nosotros. Al estar escribiendo y viendo por la ventana, veo la mitad de una docena de pájaros pequeños parados en un arbusto. Su presencia nos recuerda al amor de Dios y su cuidado por cada uno de nosotros. Si algo que parece tan insignificante

o fortuito lo conoce Dios, ¡cuánto más nosotros somos amados y cuidados! Toma un momento, mira el mundo alrededor tuyo, respira, inhala, y pide la ayuda de Dios en tus necesidades. Dale vuelta a ese asunto y pon tu confianza en un Dios amoroso.

Recuerda, sin embargo, Jesús pocas veces sana sin algún tipo de acción de nuestra parte. Cuando pongas tus preocupaciones en las manos de Dios, quizá pueden ser necesarios otros pasos. ¿Es tiempo de sacar una cita con un profesional? ¿Hora de ponerle nombre al problema? ¿O es el tiempo para confesarse en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación? La fuerza del mal surge por permanecer en la oscuridad. Cuando ya no nos cerramos o sufrimos solos, sino que compartimos nuestras preocupaciones con alguien, podemos empezar a crecer, sanar y empezar a superarlos. Rara vez es mágico o instantáneo. Es un proceso prologado y difícil. Pero nos aferramos a un recordatorio sencillo, "¡tú eres más valioso que muchos pájaros!"

Estos son los nuevos procedimientos orientadores:

1. Las máscaras son necesarias en todo momento mientras están dentro de la iglesia.
2. La temperatura corporal se comprobará antes de entrar en la iglesia.
3. Sentarse dentro de la iglesia se adhiere al distanciamiento social de seis pies.
4. Se requiere desinfección de manos.
5. Permanecerá en su asiento asignado en todo momento, sin itinerancia por la iglesia.
6. Las personas de alto riesgo, aquellas mayores de 65 años, que están inmunocomprobadas o que tienen condiciones de salud subyacentes, deben permanecer en casa.
7. Mantenga el distanciamiento físico (6 pies de separación).

## ¿Sabía Usted?

*Esté consciente de los peligros de envenenamiento en el hogar*

Más del 90 por ciento de los envenenamientos ocurren en el hogar. Los padres de familia deben saber cuáles son los mayores riesgos que corren los niños (¡especialmente los niños que ponen objetos en su boca!) y trabajar para erradicarlos. El primero en la lista es el envenenamiento por plomo, especialmente en las casas antiguas donde se ha usado pintura o polvos a base de plomo. Las baterías de botones (redondas y planas) son pequeñas y brillantes, muy usadas en muchos juguetes y aparatos electrónicos regados por la casa. Tragarse una de estas puede ser fatal para los niños. Lo mismo ocurre con los líquidos limpiadores que se usan en la casa, como los detergentes empaquetados en pequeñas burbujas de plástico que se usan para lavar la ropa o los platos. ### 1. HEAR

### 2. PRAY

Today's Gospel reminds us of God's love and care for every person. In recent weeks, we have seen and heard many things about the problem of racism in our country. Let this Gospel help you hear how God is speaking to you and calling you to respond to this issue.

- Spend a few minutes reflecting on your experience of these current events. Talk to Jesus about what surfaces in your reflection.
- Mindful of these things, re-read today's Gospel.
- What do you hear Jesus saying through this reading about racism and/or those who are victims of racism?
- What is God asking of you at this time?

### 3. TALK

Questions to discuss in your household or with friends:

- When I see others being treated differently because of their race, what can I do? How can I speak up?
- How can I be of an example of Jesus' love for all people?

#### Household Activity

Make and decorate a yard sign using faith-based language highlighting the value of each person and God's love for them. E.g. You are loved; We are all created in God's image; Your voice matters. Consider making a second yard sign for your neighbor. Use this as a chance to listen to them about these important issues and share with them how God sees all people (while practicing social distancing, of course!).
