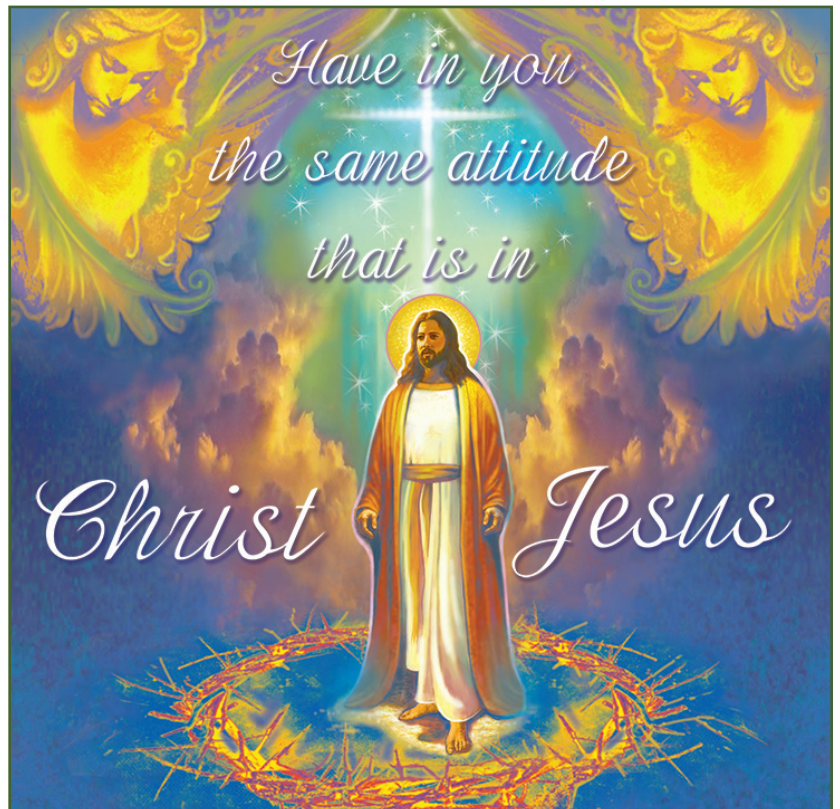

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Readings: Is 5:1-7; Ps 80:9, 12, 13-14, 15-16, 19-20; Phil 4:6-9; Mt 21:33-43

Connected to Tradition

The Church presents today's Old Testament and Gospel readings together, as a pair. We delight in the symmetry between the two passages. Jesus, who is the Word of God, knows the Hebrew scriptures by heart and intends for his parable to echo Isaiah. As Jesus begins speaking, he summons the words of Isaiah, knowing his learned audience of chief priests and elders will feel comfortable with a familiar scripture passage. These scholars recognize immediately that Jesus is referring to a prophetic passage about sin, about the chosen people's tendency to turn away from God and grow "wild."

Amazed by Innovation

What Jesus does next surprises his audience. He adds a new twist to Isaiah's well-known words, adding a new character, the landowner's very own son. Adding this innovation shows that Jesus confirms the

prophet's warning—that God longs for "his cherished plant" to grow according to the divine plan. The narrative twist also allows Jesus to reveal the fullness of God's plan in a way his audience can understand. Like a master teacher, Jesus respects the knowledge and faithfulness of the chief priests and elders, and then builds on what they know. By adding the landowner's son to the parable of the vineyard, Jesus gently expresses his own mission as the Son of God. Matthew's Gospel often depicts the chief priests and elders as oppositional; they worry that Jesus will abolish the law and foment rebellion. As the Lord said earlier in Matthew's Gospel, however, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill" (Matthew 5:17). Jesus' audience is skeptical about him, horrified at the thought of a mere human being claiming that he is the Son of God. Jesus' masterful approach provides an opportunity for his audience to give him the benefit of the doubt. In this way, Jesus proposes—not imposes—his kingship, inviting us all to follow him.

Cyberbullying is still a threat with distance learning

This year, with school starting online children of all ages will be interacting with one another via technology even more than usual. Be on the lookout for signs that bullying is happening via the internet, texting, various apps, or social media – as challenging as it is, monitor both the amount of time your children are “plugged in” and the content of what they are doing when interacting with their peers. Cyberbullying can include the use of apps, texts, photographs, and images that are intended to hurt, harass, embarrass, or even destroy the reputation of a victim. Unlike at school, you cannot walk away from cyberbullying — it spreads instantly, 24/7. Children who are cyberbullied may avoid going online or talking to their so-called friends. Conectándose a la tradición

La Iglesia presenta a la lectura del Antiguo Testamento y del Evangelio juntas, como un par. Nos alegramos con la simetría entre los dos pasajes. Jesús, que es la Palabra de Dios, conoce de memoria las Escrituras hebreas y pretende que su parábola haga eco a Isaías. Cuando Jesús empieza a hablar invoca las palabras de Isaías, sabiendo que su audiencia son los principales sacerdotes y ancianos que son conocedores de las Escrituras y su interpretación, estarían familiarizados con ese pasaje de las Escrituras. Por eso reconocen inmediatamente que Jesús se refería a un pasaje profético sobre el pecado, sobre la tendencia del pueblo elegido de alejarse de Dios y volverse “salvaje”.

Sorprendiéndose por la innovación

Lo que Jesús hace a continuación sorprende a su audiencia; añade un nuevo giro a las palabras muy conocidas de Isaías, añade un nuevo personaje, el propio hijo del dueño de las tierras. Al añadir esta innovación muestra que Jesús confirma la advertencia del profeta, que Dios anhela que “su preciada planta” crezca según el plan divino.

El giro narrativo también permite a Jesús revelar la plenitud del plan de Dios en una forma que su audiencia pueda entender. Como un maestro, Jesús respeta el conocimiento y la fidelidad de los principales sacerdotes y ancianos, y luego construye sobre lo que saben ellos. Al añadir al hijo del dueño de las tierras a la parábola de la viña, Jesús expresa gentilmente su propia misión como el Hijo de Dios. El Evangelio de Mateo a menudo presenta como opositores a los jefes de los sacerdotes y ancianos; les preocupa que Jesús suprima la ley y fomente la rebelión. Sin embargo, en el Evangelio de Mateo, Jesús había dicho antes: “no piensen que he venido a abolir las enseñanzas de la ley y los profetas; no he venido a abolirlas, sino a llevarlas hasta sus últimas consecuencias” (Mateo 5:17). La audiencia de Jesús es escéptica acerca de él, horrorizada ante la idea de que un mero ser humano afirme que es el Hijo de Dios. El enfoque magistral de Jesús le da a su audiencia el beneficio de la duda. De esta manera, Jesús propone, no impone, su realeza, invitándonos a todos a seguirlo.

El regalo del reino de Dios

El Evangelio de hoy según san Mateo amplía considerablemente la balada de Isaías. Una comparación con el mismo relato en el Evangelio según san Marcos muestra que aquí el autor se ocupa de enseñar a su comunidad de judío-cristianos: “Este es un relato sobre el Israel de antaño; y es también un relato sobre Jesús y los dudosos líderes”. Jesús llegó a decir a estos líderes judíos que ellos eran los viñadores que primero apedrearon a sus propios profetas. Y le dijo a los líderes que ellos eran los viñadores que pronto se desharían de él, Jesús, y que, al hacerlo, renunciarían a su papel privilegiado de presentar al Mesías prometido al mundo. “Y éste”, dice el Evangelio según san Mateo, “es un relato sobre ustedes, los herederos de lo que fue primeramente ofrecido a Israel”. El Reino de Dios fue abierto primero para Israel y ahora es ofrecido a todo el mundo, pero debe ser recibido como un regalo. Los primeros cristianos son los nuevos viñadores. La más profunda realidad del Reino de Dios es que está a disposición de toda persona sobre la faz de la tierra, incluso a Israel.

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San Francisco de Asís

Francisco nació en Asís, Italia, en la familia Bernardone, una familia rica dedicada al comercio de telas. A los veinte años se unió al ejército y cayó prisionero y enfermo; durante su recuperación algo cambió en él y comenzó a descubrir a Dios en lo ordinario de la vida. Sus encuentros con Dios en la contemplación de la naturaleza fueron cada vez más frecuentes hasta que descubrió que los verdaderos tesoros están en el cielo. Regaló los bienes de su padre a los pobres, pero su padre, Pietro, estaba tan molesto que después de golpearlo lo llevó frente al obispo. Ahí, Francisco se desnudó y le dio su ropa, pues pertenecía a su padre y se fue a vivir a una pequeña iglesia llamada Porciúncula. Dios le pidió que renovara la Iglesia, pero no materialmente, sino espiritualmente. ¡Y lo hizo! Recordó la esencia de vivir pobre para abrazar así a los pobres, que son la única riqueza. Fundó la Orden de los Frailes Menores (Franciscanos) y murió a los 44 años llevando en su cuerpo los estigmas de la Pasión.
