Some Words from the Pastor

Who is your favorite saint? You may have one or more to whom you are devoted and from whom you ask for prayers and intercessions. Is it safe to say that your desire to emulate them is a given, aside from seeking only their favors? Certainly they are the holy ones who are now with God in heaven. As our catechism would teach us, they are the holy ones who lead a life in union with God through the grace of Christ and they received the reward of eternal life.

The celebration of the Solemnity of All Saints Day reminds us of our own calling towards holiness. As the Lord says, "Be holy as your heavenly Father is holy. It is therefore possible for us to grow in holiness with the grace of God. The saints are proof that we too can be holy and can become saints. That is our ultimate calling. We do not have to wait for sister death to attain sainthood. We continue to live a life of faith, amidst the struggles and challenges that we may encounter. There is always hope for us in this life as we strive to live our faith and follow Jesus.

Pope Francis says that the celebration of the Solemnity of All the Saints is a day of hope. "Hope is a little like leaven that expands our souls. There are difficult moments in life, but with hope the soul goes forward and looks ahead to what awaits us. Today is a day of hope. Our brothers and sisters are in the presence of God and we shall also be there, through the pure grace of the Lord if we walk along the

way of Jesus."

Let us ask for the prayers of our Blessed Mother who was privileged to be with her Son Jesus in heaven. She is our Mother of Hope. She is our greatest intercessor in heaven. We are culminating the month of the rosary with the celebration of the Living Rosary on October 31. We make a human rosary with each person representing a bead. May the beads be symbolic of our connectedness to and union with Jesus through Mary, and likewise, to one another as we strive to emulate our Blessed Mother whose virtues and traits can truly inspire us to live a holy and saintly life. Pray for me too. Pray for us your priests. Pray that we persevere and continue serving the People of God with joy, as we bring and share the Gospel of Joy.

The Mission

Successful organizations live by strong mission statements. All Saints' Day reminds the Church of her mission: to know the love of God on earth in order to experience the fullness of God's happiness forever in heaven. The Church herself—and each one of us, her members—can use this celebration to give thanks and to renew our commitment to evangelization. If the heart of Jesus desires to unite all souls in heaven, then we must spend time every day actively praying for and serving God's people. In our words and actions, we can pour Christ's love into the world. We can be the light of the world, reminding everyone that this life is a foretaste of what is to come.

The Reward

God's enemy, Satan, does not want us to think of heaven, prepare for heaven, or long for heaven's peace. Satan wants us to forget about our connection to the Lord and live only for the glory we can find here

and now. We feel that hellish pull whenever we grow tired of doing good, especially when no one appreciates or thanks us. We know the temptation to despair when we hear skeptics ridicule believers, especially if we can't point to convincing evidence that God provides for us that there is a life after this one. These shaky, uncomfortable experiences may come to us once in a while, or they may take root in our hearts and burden us for years. This is precisely why we must celebrate All Saints' Day with hearty gladness, because every single blessed soul in heaven is praying for us. The Communion of Saints is real, and the strength that Jesus sends to us through their prayers makes an actual difference in our lives. Just as we pray for one another here on earth, our big brothers and sisters in Christ continue to pray for us, inviting us to know and share the love of God.

Did you Know?

Cyberbullying is still a threat with distance learning

This year, with school starting online children of all ages will be interacting with one another via technology even more than usual. Be on the lookout for signs that bullying is happening via the internet, texting, various apps, or social media – as challenging as it is, monitor both the amount of time your children are “plugged in” and the content of what they are doing when interacting with their peers. Cyberbullying can include the use of apps, texts, photographs, and images that are intended to hurt, harass, embarrass, or even destroy the reputation of a victim. Unlike at school, you cannot walk away from cyberbullying — it spreads instantly, 24/7. Children who are cyberbullied may avoid going online or talking to their so-called friends. Martín nació en Perú, de madre africana y padre español. Debido al racismo de su tiempo, su padre lo abandonó y aun así, siendo muy pobre, cuidó de los más pobres que él. A los 12 años aprendió el oficio de barbero y enfermería, oficio que desempeñó con una caridad sin par. Pidió ser admitido con los frailes menores de la orden de los Dominicos pero no lo aceptaron debido al color de su piel. Nueve años después se le permitió hacer sus votos perpetuos en la comunidad. Martín no guardaba odio para nadie, sólo amor. Puesto que además de pasar horas y horas frente al Santísimo Sacramento cuidaba de los enfermos dentro del monasterio, fuera de él y en todo Perú, la gente le llamó: "Martín de la caridad". En su canonización el Papa Juan XXIII dijo de que se "ejercitaba inmensamente en la caridad para con sus hermanos, caridad que era fruto de su fe íntegra y de su humildad. Amaba a su prójimo porque los consideraba verdaderos hijos de Dios y hermanos suyos". Fue canonizado en 1962.
