Some Words from the Pastor

We had an amazing Sunday last weekend. A lot of people came to church. Indeed, people are coming back when they learned that we are already celebrating the masses inside the church. There were more people than we expected at the 10:30 AM mass when the church was full, with the social distancing of course, and a lot of people also had to stay in the tents. It is a clear sign that people are truly wanting to go back to the church. The time and season should also contribute to this phenomenon as people start to immerse themselves during Lent. This season enjoins us to participate in the celebration of the paschal mystery of our Lord Jesus Christ - his passion, death and resurrection. As we renew our faith in the Lord, let us be rejoice and be grateful for God's love and mercy. The color this weekend, which is Pink or Rose, reveals the underlying joy behind Christ's passion and death. It manifests what is to come as we look forward to the celebration of the glorious resurrection of Christ. It is for this reason that this fourth Sunday is called Laetere Sunday. It is a day of rejoicing. We rejoice in the salvation which the Lord is giving us as we enter continually into the discipline of Lent. Let us rejoice at the truth of the Lord saving and redeeming us from sin and death. With him we shall have life. We have the First Scrutiny of the Elect last Sunday. We rejoice with our sisters and brothers who are preparing for the celebration and reception of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation. This weekend we shall have the second scrutiny of the elect. The readings are from Year A. The gospel tells the story of the blind man who was able to see. Jesus took away his

blindness when he cured him by opening his eyes. The Lord enabled him to see. Lent is a time of enlightenment. We can acknowledge the fact that there are moments when we become blind because of our selfishness, greed, inordinate attachments to material things, self-righteousness, and lack of belief. This is a moment to ask the Lord to heal us from our own blindness so that we are able to see. May we be able to see God's goodness and kindness. May we be able to see our brothers and sisters who are in need of love and care. We pray that we may always see our Lord Jesus Christ in our journey of faith. He is the Way, the Truth and the Life. May we always see our way to the Father through Jesus. He was sent by the Father to to redeem us. In the gospel of John for Year B, it tells us about God's love for us. It is for this reason that he sent His Son Jesus, not to condemn, but to save us. His love reveals his generosity which is boundless. His mercy is great which allows us to rejoice in the forgiveness that he gives us. On this Laetere Sunday, let us rejoice and be glad.

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Today's Readings: 2 Chr 36:14–16, 19–23; Ps 137:1–2, 3, 4–5, 6; Eph 2:4–10; Jn 3:14–21

Human History...

Today's reading from 2 Chronicles is the conclusion of these two volumes, a brief summary of Judah's infidelity under a sequence of kings and the subsequent seventy years of exile in Babylon. This abbreviated sequence recaps the events treated in earlier chapters, concluding with Jerusalem being conquered and its inhabitants deported by to Babylon.

After the Babylonians were conquered by Cyrus and the Persians, Cyrus built the great Persian Empire that covered almost the entire ancient Near East. Unlike the earlier Assyrians and Babylonians, Cyrus did not rule by deporting and enslaving peoples he defeated. Instead, he organized his empire into regional governments and funded their construction projects, ruling over all with the title King of Kings (among others). In this spirit, Cyrus urged the exiles to return to Jerusalem to rebuild their temple and their native culture. In Jewish terms, Cyrus was a "messiah" (Hebrew), or a christos (Greek), someone anointed by God to carry out this divine mission.

...And Divine Rescue

The return from exile in Babylon was second only to the Exodus from Egypt as a founding narrative shaping the Jewish identity into which Jesus was born and in which his church took root and began to grow. If we read between the lines of the two New Testament readings from today, we can see the outlines of this same pattern of God bringing humanity from sorrow into joy: The Hebrews' slavery in Egypt and the Judeans' exile in Babylonia reveal a universal truth, that we belong to the God who is "rich in mercy," and we are assured that "when we were dead in our transgressions," God "so loved the world" that he sent Jesus to be the way of our redemption, our salvation.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is sometimes called "Laetare Sunday," or "Rejoice! Sunday." Even if we feel overwhelmed by the darkness of sin (our own and others'), wondering whether God really is working on our behalf, we can put our faith in today's Word that it is so. For this, we can truly rejoice—we are more than halfway to Easter!

Cyberbullying is still a threat with distance learning

Cyberbullying can include the use of apps, texts, photographs, and images that are intended to hurt, harass, embarrass, or even destroy the reputation of a victim. Unlike at school, you cannot walk away from cyberbullying — it spreads instantly, 24/7. Children who are cyberbullied may avoid going online or talking to their so-called friends. Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma

Lecturas de hoy: 2 Cr 36:14—16, 19–23; Sal 137 (136):1–2, 3, 4–5, 6; Ef 2:4–10; Jn 3:14–21

La Historia de la Humanidad...

La lectura de hoy del libro 2 Crónicas es la conclusión de estos dos libros, un resumen breve de la infidelidad de Judá bajo una serie de reyes y los subsiguientes setenta años de exilio en Babilonia. Esta serie abreviada resume los eventos que se trataron en los capítulos anteriores, concluyendo con la conquista de Jerusalén y la deportación de sus habitantes a Babilonia.

Después de que los babilonios fueron conquistados por Ciro y los persas, Ciro construyó el gran Imperio Persa que incluía todo el antiguo Oriente Cercano. A diferencia de los anteriores asirios y babilonios, Ciro no gobernó deportando y esclavizando a los pueblos que derrotaba. Al contrario, él organizó su imperio en gobiernos regionales y financió sus proyectos de construcción, gobernando sobre todo con el título (entre otros) Rey de Reyes. Con este espíritu, Ciro instó a los exiliados a regresar a Jerusalén para que reconstruyeran su templo y su cultura originaria. En términos judíos, Ciro era un “mesías” (hebreo) o un cristo (griego), alguien ungido por Dios para llevar a cabo esta misión divina.

...Y el Rescato de Divino

El regreso del exilio de Babilonia fue el segundo después del Éxodo de Egipto, como una narración fundacional que determinó la identidad judía en la que nació Jesús y en la que la Iglesia se enraizó y comenzó a crecer. Si leemos entre las líneas de las dos lecturas del Nuevo Testamento de hoy, podemos ver los contornos de este mismo patrón de Dios trayendo a la humanidad del dolor al gozo: la esclavitud de los hebreos en Egipto y el exilio de los judíos en Babilonia revelan una verdad universal, que pertenecemos al Dios que es “rico en misericordia”, y se nos asegura que “cuando estábamos muertos en nuestras transgresiones”, Dios “amó tanto al mundo” que envió a Jesús para que fuera el camino de nuestra redención, nuestra salvación. El Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma a veces se le suele llamar “Domingo Laetare”, o “Domingo de la Alegría”. Incluso si nos sentimos abrumados por la oscuridad del pecado (del nuestro y de otros), preguntándonos si Dios realmente está obrando en nuestro favor, podemos poner nuestra fe en la Palabra de hoy de que es así. Por esto, podemos regocijarnos de verdad, ¡estamos a más de medio camino para la Pascua!
