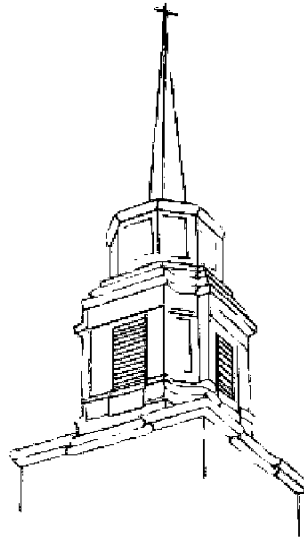

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Today's Gospel passage of Jesus' encounter with the ten lepers is the classic thanksgiving text. Indeed, it is the Gospel passage for the Mass on Thanksgiving Day. Which is why it must have reminded me to announce that the annual parish missionary trip to Brit's Home and St. Francois Parish in Grand Goave, Haiti has been scheduled for July 19 – 25, 2020. Over the next couple of months, the parish Haitian Apostolate will be providing information regarding the trip. This will be directed both to those who are interested in making the trip and to those who are interested in supporting our pilgrims as well as the orphanage and the parish. January 12, 2020 will mark the 10th anniversary of the Haitian earthquake which took the life of Britney Gengel and over 300,000 other people. I cannot help but believe that this anniversary will be an opportunity for many to receive special graces. These graces will be available to all those who open their hearts to the Haitian people in any way. Of the many things which I have learned on my trips to that beautiful and terrible island, the vital force of gratitude is the most instructive.

On our trip in 2017, we helped to build a home for a husband and wife. During that week, the husband was working up in the mountains, so we did not meet him until the last day. The wife, though, was present each day. Along with a few of her neighbors, she helped and encouraged us throughout the week. She wore a t-shirt which read something along the lines of: "I saw it, I wanted it, I got it." I told her that I was sure the shirt had come from the United States! On the last day, when we were blessing and then turning over the key to her new home, she had changed. In place of the t-shirt was her best dress. Her hair had been styled meticulously. As you know, I am crier, but it wasn't only me that was moved by her gratitude. The truth be told, it is the Haitian workers hired by Be Like Brit who do most of the work. Plus, the "house" of which we speak is smaller than my office in the rectory. I could not help but realize that her gratitude was out of proportion to what she had received. I recognized, too, that this was an indictment of me. How much more grateful that I could be.

It is difficult to know how the Haitians carry on in the face of the tragedy and trauma that has dominated their history. It is, certainly, grace. Thankfully, it is a grace which they openly express and freely share.
