

Dear Friends in the Lord,

The work inside the church was completed this week. It is beautiful. Yet another reason I wish that we were all back together again. Here is the recap of the scope of the work: the pews have been refurbished, the flooring underneath the pews, the carpet throughout the main church and the floor treads at the entrance have all been replaced. The walls, where needed, have been patched and painted. Did I mention that it is beautiful? My thanks to Cole Contracting for their cooperation, efforts, and skill. There is still work ongoing. At present, the bathroom in the suite that Fr. Brice will occupy is being redone – and he deserves it! There is also plenty of work about to begin on the exterior of both the church (repairing and replacing gutters and downspouts) and the rectory (repairing part of the roof, replacing and repairing gutters and downspouts and removing the small tree in one of the chimneys).

Obviously, this work costs money. Thanks to your weekly generosity and to a generous bequest that we received this year we are able to afford the cost of maintaining our historic buildings. Indeed, when Fiscal Year 2019/2020 ends on this coming Tuesday we will have a significant operating surplus this year. This is not unusual but given what a struggle that 2020 has been for so many, I am especially grateful for your generosity and kindness. When the year ends, Team Archibald will prepare an annual report for the Finance Committee. After they review and approve it the report will be published. Hopefully, we will all be back together, and you will be able to see it with the bulletin. Either way, it will be available through Flocknote and the parish website, as well. The Annual Report for our Food for the Poor program will also be made available – and will look as good as the parish report, too.

At every Mass since the pandemic began, we have been concluding the Prayers of the Faithful with the Prayer in Time of Pandemic. We will continue to do so. To add more voices to this prayer and others, we are preparing a prayer sheet. It will have the Gloria and the Creed (because I cannot memorize the "new" translation!), the Prayer of St. Michael the Archangel and the Prayer in Time of Pandemic. These sheets will be available beginning next weekend. Since we cannot have the sheets remain in the church, we are asking those attending Mass here on Temple Street take a sheet for yourself and bring it with you in the weeks ahead. Those who attend Mass through the live stream can find the prayers both on the parish website and in the weekly Flocknote emails.
